Bet you thought there wouldn't be a newsletter this month! But you were WRONG! Again work interfered with the latest edition. Yeah yeah same lame excuse.

The April meeting was held at the garage of Fred Marx. Crappy weather probably contributed to the light turn out but a few of us did manage to crack our heads on the lift arms that day. I'm going to start wearing a helmet when I go to Fred's.

The task of the day was to bleed the brakes on Fred's Spyder. All new lines, hoses, wheel cylinders and fluid made the job fairly ease except for one pesky bleeder. Fred had installed speed bleeders and apparently one was defective. If you are not familiar with Speed Bleeders they replace the standard bleeder on our cars with one that allows for a one person operation. They have a one way check ball and spring internally that prevent air from being drawn back into the brake system when you let the brake pedal back up during bleeding. The Speed Bleeders only allow fluid to flow out of the cylinder when the pedal is pushed and creates enough pressure to force the ball and spring to move. Once you let off the pedal the spring pushes the check ball back in place preventing air from entering the brake hydraulic system. Pretty neat product but as with all man made products you do get a bad one every now and then.

Which is why there are warranties. A quick run to the local advance auto parts who sells a version of speed bleeder and we were able to finish the brake system on the Spyder. One step closer to getting Fred's car back on the road again. I always think it is better to make sure you can stop the car BEFORE you see if it will drive under it's own power.

It won't be long before the car is back on all fours and ready to drive again.

## **Tech Tip** Brakes

For no real good reason brakes are a part of most cars that are taken for granted until you hit the pedal and it goes to the floor. No Fred Flintstone brakes! Brakes require regular service in the form of adjustment, inspection for fluid leaks and flush and replacement of the brake fluid. With our cars 50+ years old it is a good idea to do a full inspection each year. That involves pulling the drums to inspect the drums and shoes for wear. Look for leaking wheel cylinders. Inspect the flexable brake line hoses for leaks and swelling and the most overlooked part, the brake fluid. Brake fluid is hydroscopic meaning that it attracts moisture in the air. That moisture will settle in the wheel cylinders and rust them internally. Our wheel cylinders are becoming harder to find so it's important that you flush the brake fluid at least every two years. Use Dot 3 synthetic fluid which is available at local parts stores. A good test to check the brakes is with the car stopped push down on the brake pedal as hard as you can. The pedal should feel firm and hard. Keep pressing down hard and make sure the pedal does not slowly move toward the floor. If it does it's time to start looking for the cause which could be a master cylinder or leaking wheel cylinder.
