

Carburetor Tech Tip, by David Robertson

The 65-67 carburetors have a high speed enrichment valve under the venturi cluster. If the car sits for a long time these valves get stuck shut and hurt performance. I've had good luck removing them with a T20 Torx (star) screwdriver. The ridged tips of the T20 lodge nicely in the hole drilled in the top of this small brass needle valve. A little twisting will usually break the valve loose so you can clean the valve, its seat, and the passageway back into the float bowl.

Once in awhile when restoring a car you run across a product that is right under your nose and you don't even realize it. I ran across something that is worth sharing with other club members and car enthusiast[s]. I am talking about a paint product I use while restoring the Monza wagon and have used it again this week on the Greenbrier. We all know that like gas, paint being a petroleum product has also become expensive and GOOD paint is not always available or within the budget. I found a paint at the Tractor Supply Store. Yes that's right, Tractor Supply Store that is truly outstanding and I am referring to "Agrisystems Tractor & Implement Enamel," made by the Valspar Corp and comes in various colors, usually the colors you generally see on farm equipment. Wonder why?? I use the number 4432-19 Low Gloss Black enamel to paint floors, under fenders, engine firewalls, chassis components...etc. It comes in quarts and gallons, its anti-rust, lead free and can be used on metal or wood by brushing or spraying. It is tough man!! Highly weather resistance (just look at all those thousands of combines, tractors and other farm equipment left out in the elements all year). So rush on down to you[r] local TSS and get a can. It's gooooood !!
