After the last meeting, Rita and I met Darren and his wife at the Rockville Antique and Classic Car show. They were displaying their Rampside as part of Group Corvair.

Upon arriving, the team had the fully assembled engine sitting on a tire that was on a floor jack (looks like my motorcycle jack) and were getting it aligned with the engine compartment. Next, the car was lowered leaving enough room for a few people to get under the car to guide the powerpack into place. Using the floor jack, the powerpack was raised into position and the front and rear mounts were tightened and out came the jack. Getting the engine back onto the car would have been a good day but there was a buzz in the air, and it was decided that we were going to get the engine running.

The crew had dwindled a bit by this time but everyone (I mean everyone) that remained had a hand in working on something at this point. There was wiring, fuel lines, exhaust, fuel pump, generator (on and off a few times) distributor, brakes, shrouds, etc. and we worked our way through each task until it was ready for the first turn of the key.

With a shot of ether, the engine fire up but died due to lack of fuel. We did that a few times and realized the fuel pump was not working. After loosening the hold down bolt, we tried to hand pump it only to find that it was leaking really bad. After tightening the six bolts on the top of the pump and a few hand pumps fuel was making it to the carb. One more shot of ether and car started and ran. The earlier buzz was now pure excitement.

The engine idled at different speeds for 20 minutes or so with the only issue being a leaky

valve cover gasket. It also smoked a lot but that was expected on a new build. Fortunately, Fred's garage has a rear garage door so both doors were opened, and the wind helped clear the air somewhat.

We celebrated the success by cracking open a few beers while listening to the beautiful sound of the freshly rebuilt motor making music.

Mark returned to Fred's on Tuesday to help button up a few more things. They took out the Turbo Oil Tee and resealed it with Teflon tape to fix a leak there. That required taking the generator off again. Installation of the generator went a lot quicker after all the practice. They also adjusted the trunk latch so it will close and latch.


There was one last issue with the brake lights not going off after releasing the pedal. The heater, air, and defrost cables were routed to the right side of the brake pedal arm and were putting pressure on the arm of the pedal. That was causing the brakes lights to stay on. They were able to reroute them between clutch and brake pedal arms and the brakes lights work as expected.

RnR garage

After getting the garage organized, I got back to finishing the brakes. I finished bending, flaring, and connecting the remaining lines and started to bleed the brakes. This turned out to be a real challenge. No amount of pumping the brake pedal would push fluid out of the master cylinder nor the wheel cylinders.

Then I remembered a friend from work having a vacuum bleeder, so I asked if I could borrow it. Not only was I able to borrow the bleeder but my buddy came over too. I am thankful that Ryan was there since he knew how the tool worked. For systems that only require the bleeding of a wheel cylinder or caliber, it is a one-person job.

However, new systems are a two-person job since it was void of fluid. It also took patience before fluid started flowing. Once it did, the master cylinder required filling a number of times as the fluid filled the system. After an hour we had the system filled and bled and a few fittings tightened along the way.

Now was time to start it and test the brakes. With a little coexing the engine came to life. With the e-brake engaged, I applied pressure on the brake pedal and shifted it into reverse. I released the e-brake and eased off the brake pedal and Rampy slowly moved backwards. I hit the brakes and it came to a stop. Shifting into forward I repeated the process eventually aming it halfway up the driveway as my confidence built on each pass. The brakes were a success as was the transmission (as far as I could test it) and we are happy the project has reached another milestone with more to come.
