Vernon's Garage

Tire rotation, wheels, and lug nuts

My annual tire rotation was approaching so I thought it should be accomplished before Christmas and my last long ride. As per the shop manual section 10 page 5, cross the backs to the front and place the front tires on their same side at back. The shop manual says 45 to 65 pounds torque. I've always wondered if this is enough, so I use the higher number. As a side note, 2004 Chevy avalanche with 17 inch wheels and six lugs is 140 pounds of torque.

I have 14 inch wheels. That being said, I have noticed that one pair is the same configuration and the other pair is different. One pair has bumps between the lugs, one pair is smooth.

The lug size is 7/16 x 20, which is the GM standard until the early 80s when GM change to metric lugs and nuts. The mounting holes for the lug nuts almost swallowed the 3/4 hex 7/16 x 20 nuts. After a quick online search, I procured a set of 20 bulging 7/16 x 20 nuts to increase the contact area in the mounting hole. I will continue to research the origins of the wheels, they have some numbers and symbols stamped but it won't be as easy as a fender tag or VIN.

The Corsa tech guide, Corvair basics and the Corvair shop guide were invaluable in my research.

The new beefier lug nut is on the left.



Onto a weird issue that both Greg W and I have experienced. We both have the Stinger ignition and it is great – when it works. If you remember, Grea installed his last year and it immediately failed. He sent it back to Performance Corvairs. Seth replaced a bad module and it worked great until about a week ago. The module failed again. It was fixed and, along with the distributor, Seth sent another module for self repair. About two months ago, the distributor in our car went bad. Seth helped me with the troubleshooting and it was determined the module was bad. He repaired it and I just installed it. It works great for now. But what is causing the modules to go bad? We don't want to be stuck 100 miles from home with no quick fix and I don't want to carry my old dizzy.
