Rita made a great spread of egg mash, fruit salad, bagels, donuts, coffee, etc. to make sure everyone was fed and fueled. By the way, while Rita and I like a good drive we really like when the meetings are close by! I think Mark W got a few good pictures of the group and at least one of me actually working!

At first I was in my typical role of the tool guy but once the lower fins came off along with the manifolds (logs) I was busy cleaning the seat surfaces where the gaskets (donuts) sit. Fred gave me a great tip on how to clean them fast, which worked beautifully. I had to use the Dremel on the seat surface of #5 due to carbon build up. The original gaskets were in bad shape especially #5. The reason for #5 was that whenever the PO changed the gaskets the manifold hit the shroud that funnels the hot air into the heater and it never seated properly.

Lee made some tools to remove the old gaskets mainly #5, which was welded onto the down tube. I also removed some metal from the curved part of the shroud that wraps around the manifold just in case it needed a bit more clearance. I care more about not poisoning ourselves then heat for the car.

The manifolds went back on quickly, the tins went on, and then the exhaust. After an initial hand check for leaks, we tightened the u pipe collars a bit more and I took it for a short ride. I need to check everything after a couple of miles but I am positive the work done today took care of the exhaust leak and the CO in the cabin.

Again, thanks to everyone for all the help and support. Unfortunately, I had to "go to work" so the meeting broke up around 1:00 but we are looking forward to the next meeting at Ron's house.

This is the fun part of having a club like NVCC. Everyone gets to pitch in and help a fellow owner with their car. We also learn from doing. It is almost impossible to find a shop or mechanic to work on Corvairs these days so that makes the meetings so important.

As most of we Corvair owners tend to do, I have accumulated a considerable collection of parts in my garage. All are late model and with our pending downsizing I find it necessary to hold a Corvair Parts yard sale to reduce the size of my stash. The amount is nothing like the size of other collections like Frank or Bryan but there may be a gem in the pile you need. Some of the parts include:

Engine tin, Flywheels, Pressure Plates, a front bumper. Front panel where wiper mechanism is located, Wiper motors, Fuel pump and alternator cores for rebuilding. Trim parts and some new parts from Clarks.

I also have all the parts and pieces to put together a 66 140. The block is an RM block. The pistons assemblies have been balanced and all weigh the same. I checked them with a digital scale. New ARP connecting rod bolts installed. The pistons are .40 over and have been octane cut by the PO. Crank has been machined and polished. Cam comes with failsafe gear. This has the makings of a nice engine. Just needs to be put together with new bearings, rings and gaskets. I also have three carbs for the engine. I would like to sell the entire ASSY as one but if no one is interested will part out.

66 4 speed and 355 Diff out of my Corsa also available. They will need to be gone over and probably freshened up.

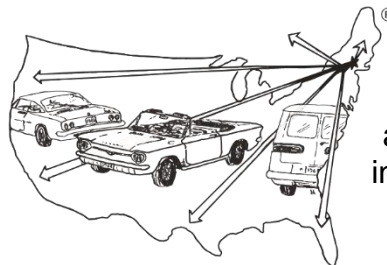
