Max Roeder showed and talked about his project "Snowball" Corvair with twin turbos, fuel injection, intercoolers and much more.

Engine Cleaning

How to get 40 years of gunk off an engine By Greg Renfro

While working on my son's Corvair I came across a dilemma. We needed to rebuild the engine and therefore need to clean up all the parts for the build. For a while I scraped and scrubbed with rags and solvents and steel wool but still it just wasn't quite clean. Becoming tired of the process I started asking some of the more experienced members of the local Corvair club how to go about getting this stuff clean. One suggestion that seemed to make sense was using Simple Green in a 5 gallon bucket. I thought about it and that made great sense for the smaller parts but what to do with the block?

Here is the solution I came up with along with the recipe I used to do the job.

First I went to my local Home Depot and picked up two 2 liter bottles of Simple Green and a tote tub large enough to hold the block halves. Grand total about \$17.00. So far so good.

I figured if it doesn't get the parts clean at least they will smell good.

First I put my part in the tub and poured in the Simple Green. Next I filled the tub with just enough water to cover the block half.

I wanted the mixture to be as strong as possible. I could see the solution churning so I knew it was starting to work on the dirt and grime. The next day I checked on the progress. Although it was starting to work, it wasn't as good as I had hoped for. So, I put the lid back on and left it for another day. After day 2 I looked at the part and noticed a significant improvement in the cleanliness of the part. I took a small stiff brush and brushed away almost all of the grime with very little effort. I took the part out and hit it with my pressure washer but it made almost no difference. I would not recommend using the pressure washer as it was a waste of time. I touched up a couple spots with the Dremel and a wire wheel. Next I took some PB Blaster and sprayed it on some 000 steel wool and cleaned the studs. I used some carb cleaner in an aerosol can for the final cleaning touch up. Here are the results.



First gather up a container large enough to cover the parts you wish to clean and a couple of Jumbo sized containers of Simple Green cleaner.



Next mix the Simple Green with water and submerse the part into the mixture and let soak for a couple of days. Check the mixture often.



The final result, compared with the uncleaned block half on the left Simple Green did great.

Door prize and Hospitality room donations needed for Great Plains Corvair Roundup


