


No Dues You Lose MCCA

If I recall we left Terry's shop in the sedan around 9:00AM. Yoder is about a 45 minute drive which gave us time for some good conversation. During the drive my brother called and asked what I was up to. I explained to him that I was on my way to Yoder to watch car races on the old naval base. After a short pause he said "You must be seeing someone on the side because Yoder is an Amish community and it is a thousand miles away from

the ocean. You say you are going to a naval base? Yeah right..." I assured him everything was on the up and up after which Terry and I had a good laugh.

We arrived at the course and signed waivers as spectators. The day was cool and rainy so we set up shop under a tent. We had some words of encouragement for Jim and set up to watch the warm ups. After some small issues with the timing and scoring, it was time for Jim's first run. I really had no idea what to expect. The starter gave

the signal and he was off. "Wow", I said to Terry, "I've never seen a Corvair burn rubber." Jim ran the course in a respectable 65.026 with no penalties. After Jim climbed out Terry and I went over to talk to him. Jim was complaining about the balance of the car. "I could really use some weight on the passenger side." Almost immediately Terry looked at me and I was volunteered. My only thought was wow they really take that spectator waiver a long way. But it sounded like fun so I agreed.

First challenge was getting in the car. As some may have noticed, I'm kind of a big guy. I grabbed a loaner helmet and returned to the car where Jim proceeded to give me instructions on the proper way to enter the car. First you stick you head in then one leg, fold yourself in half then settle down into the seat as you unfold. Thankfully I was still flexible enough to get it done and with the helmet on I had at least 1/4" of headroom left.

So it was time to ride. I got in I got buckled up and off to the start line we went. The starter gave the signal and we were off. Wow what a rush. I was giggling like a school girl the whole way. After we completed the run all I could say to Jim was "Wow that was cool". The only thing I could equate it with was riding on a roller coaster without the hills. Jim's second run with the human ballast was much better at a 63.016. I thought it was smooth, Jim said there was more.

We did 3 more runs. Run number 3 was a 64.403 due to a slip in one corner that easily cost us 2 seconds. (I say us because I was in effect a part of the suspension) The 4th run was a 62.348 but it felt like there was

more left. As we prepared for the 5th run it began to rain. Rain and slicks are not a good combination. We took off and quickly I could tell the lack of grip due to the wet surface. At about the half way point Jim struck a cone, then another. Jim said it all over and I could tell it was time to just have some fun for the remainder of the run. Jim drove the wheels off of the Corvair sliding and smoking the tires as I grinned ear to ear. We finished the run and I climbed out for the last time that day. All I can say is thanks a million for the ride Jim and anytime you need ballast and I'm around, I am willing.

"Get a Grip" on stubborn Gas & brake line fittings

One of the jobs I dread the most is working with the flare fittings on the Corvair fuel and brake systems. There always one fitting on the system I am working on that due to age and corrosion or the previous mechanic's brute force is very tight. Unlike messing up the wrenching surface on a bolt or nut, if the tube fitting is mauled, the whole line must be replaced.

In my younger days, once I rounded off the flats with an open end wrench, I would grab the fitting in the jaws of my "Vice Grip" pliers and wrestle the fitting loose, effective, but not very pretty and every time after that to tighten or loosen the fitting, it would have to face the "Grips".

As my budget for tools expanded, I added a set of Craftsman Flare Wrenches to the toolbox. Now I thought all my problems with flare fittings were solved, I had the proper tool. The flare wrench is like a thick walled 6 point box end wrench with a notch cut out to fit over the tube. My success rate removing flare nuts went up, but there were still occasions when even the flare wrench wasn't enough and I would have

to resort to ugly the repair with vice grip pliers.

When working on the Black and Silver Corsa coupe brakes with Mark Welte we ran into several stubborn fittings on the brake lines. After cracking the flare wrench, Mark went to the hardware store to look for a miniature pipe wrench. The True Value didn't have the wrench but talked him into trying a Vice Grip wrench, it worked great on the stubborn fittings. Unlike the pliers the wrench has jaws that fit the flats of the fitting, even flexing it a bit to help it come off.



Juna Tuna events include: Valve cover racer test 'n tune Headlight Aim-A-Thon


June 20th and the Juna Tuna is less than two weeks away. One of the highlights of the Tuna will be the opportunity to run and tune your valve cover racer before the Roundup in October. Make sure your VC racer is finished enough to run at the Tuna, if you haven't started get started now. Contact Terry Kalp if you need a cover for your racer. We can also work on constructing the racer at the Tuna, bring some wheels and we will try to scrounge up the rest. Terry will be resurfacing the track on Saturday, June 13th at his shop, any help would be appreciated.

Another great opportunity at the Tuna will be the Headlight Aim. Greg Renfro and Terry will have an area setup for you to pull your Corvair into and get the headlights aimed in less than 20 minutes. Before the Aim-a-thon it would be good to check you Corvair for burned out head lamps and make sure the plastic sockets for the headlight adjustors aren't broken. If you find problems purchase replacement bulbs and get the new sockets ordered and delivered so they can be installed at the Tuna.

There will also be time for regular Tuna activities including working on your Corvair (Mel already has some project for his convertible). Eating is also on the menu, check with Terry to see what you need to bring.
