Topeka and assembled his 140 hp engine under the watchful eyes of Ned and Jim. Mel found out a few things about the radio in his convertible he never knew before. Alan and Mark worked on brakes and U-joints on Mark's recently purchased Corsa coupe.

March 2009 Early in the month Jim, Ned and Terry went to Indianapolis for the 6th annual Corvair Performance Workshop. It was the first year in Indy and the trio toured the famous track and museum. Progress continued for the Roundup. Plans were made for MCCA members to show their Corvairs off at the weekly Friday night parking lot car shows held at Central and West street. The shows were to begin in April.

April 2009 After the first week was cancelled because of the weather, MCCA members started showing up regularly at the Central and West show for the entire season. Larry Lee had an exciting trip home from the April meeting when the steering fell apart on his LM convertible on K-15. He McGyvered a fix using his key chain to replace a cotter key and castle nut. Roundup preparations continued.

May 2009 Gary Anderson of Rochester Minnesota, was looking for a Corvair fix on the trip he was taking to Texas. He made plans with Terry to stop by the Shop and was greeted by a small band of MCCA members, and given a MCCA T-shirt. The Autocross season started and Greg gave a nice account in the newsletter of his ride in Jim's EM racer.

June 2009 This month started with another great turnout at the Lake Afton show and June meeting. Officers were elected with Greg Renfro, President; Bob Bright Vice-President, Julie Strecker, Secretary and Ned Madsen as Treasurer. At the vairy rainy Juna Tuna, enough cars were cleared from the shop so that the newly resurfaced Valve cover racetrack could be set-up and people could test run their racers. Several sets of headlights were adjusted and great food and conversation were served to everyone. At the end of June several MCCA members made the trip to Liberty, Mo to help the Kansas City Corvair club celebrate their 45th anniversary.

July 2009 The club met at Eric's shop in

downtown Wichita so members could go to the Moonlight Car Show in nearby Old Town after the meeting. Ned won a special door prize, which he donated to the Roundup.

August 2009 Terry, Ned and Jim headed out to Marshalltown, Iowa to race their Corvair at Fire and Ice. They picked up Scott Allison and Travis Bolton in Kansas City. Everyone won an award with Jim and Terry getting special recognition for the duration and style of their off track excursions.

September 2009 With the Great Plains Roundup less than a month away all the last minute details must be finished. At the September meeting everyone pitched in to stuff the goodies into the goodie bags provided by Hagerty Insurance.

October 2009 All the hard work pays off as over 40 Corvairs gather at the Best Western Airport Inn in Wichita for the 5th annual Great Plains Roundup. Friday night was the introduction of Marvin Luke's 60 Corvair, some birthday cake and valve cover races. The weather couldn't have been better on Saturday for the Car Shows, Slow Drags and Banquet. But wait that's not all. Two weeks later was Luna Tuna at the Kalp shop with MCCA buying steaks for everyone to celebrate the successful Roundup. The Tuna projects included fixing Chris Teer's Corvair that died on the way home from the Roundup, and getting a rampside running for Julie and Bernie Strecker's nephews.

November 2009 A few changes in the meeting format were introduced, starting with an agenda published in the newsletter before the meeting. It was decided to create a Board of Directors to take the boring details of club business out of the limited meeting time. Everyone had a chance to speak and inform the rest of the club about the progress on their projects.

In summary, with hosting the Great Plains Corvair Roundup it was a very busy and rewarding year in the life of the club. A Corvair showed up at the meetings 64 times last year. It was an Early 33 times, a Late 31. For five meetings the Earlies were dominant in the parking lot, for four meetings the Lates prevailed and two meeting they tied.



Radio Console fits Many Corvairs

Having several Corvairs to drive and not much appreciation of what AM radio has to offer, Terry Kalp had a problem to solve. Also he didn't want to buy several modern radios and speaker setups to install in his Corvairs, so this is the solution he came up with for modern music in vintage Corvairs.

The self-contained unit combines a modern radio and speakers in a box measuring 17 inches long, 5 inches wide, and 8.5 inches tall. It fits between the bucket seats in a LM Corvair. Bucket seats are closer together on EM Corvairs, but the unit is short enough to fit in front of the seats in EMs and any bench seat Corvair that does not have a floor shift.


Materials needed include: a DIN mount radio, a pair of 5"x 8" bookshelf speakers, a sheet of metal, 20 ga. at least 17"x 22", a chunk of wood 5"x 17" x 3/4", 4 longer 5mm screws and a flat 4 prong trailer wiring harness. Optional is a 24" square of material to cover the finished project.

First trim the wood to 5"x 17", then cut an opening in the middle for wiring and drill and countersink two holes to hold the speakers, bolt the speakers down with the new longer screws.

Once the sheet metal is trimmed to the 17"x 22" size, form it into an U shape with 8.5 inch legs and a 5" center. A portable workbench and a couple of 2x4s work well if a sheet metal brake is not available. Create an opening for the DIN radio mounting sleeve and drill two holes to mount the metal to the top of the speakers using 5mm screws. Mount the DIN

sleeve, bending the tabs to lock it in place.

Wire the radio plug to the speakers and then the constant power, switched power, dimmer and ground to the trailer side of the 4 prong plug. Be sure to use the ground wire for the plug for the ground to the radio. Run the vehicle end of the trailer plug from between the seats, under the carpet up to the fuse box where you can pick up the two power sources and ground. Again make sure you use the trailer ground for ground. Also route the antenna wire to the radio location. An extension will be needed for most front mounted antennas, a rear antenna lead can just be re-routed.

Cover the box, drop in the radio, plug it in and enjoy. Felt backed vinyl was used for this box. After the vinyl was glued down with 3M spray adhesive it wrinkled and puckered a lot . . . but the next day was flat. Add wiring and antenna drops to any other cars .


