Project Police New Project Joys

Terry Kalp picked up a Corvair powered sand rail project off of Craig's List. He knew it had a busted bellhousing, but as he pulled it apart to fix it more problems popped up. The pressure plate was held on by only four bolts, two were broken off. The remaining bolts were grade 5 rather than the grade 8 required. All the lining was off the clutch disc, the flywheel was EM pressure plate LM. The input shaft was EM, but the seal a larger LM.



Not only did the bellhousing have a huge chunk out of it, three of the bolts were MIA. Also a 1/4 inch section of the seal lip was sticking out. No wonder it leaked a little oil.
