The engine is out, apart and at the machinist waiting to get the crank and cylinders checked for wear. Owen has stayed busy sorting out the 45 year old electrical system of his motorhome. UV 500 has been upgraded to LED brake, turn and running lights.

Larry Lee has been working on installing a new top on his blue Corsa convertible. He is discovering why the pros get big bucks for the install. At last notice Larry was still chasing the wrinkles around.

After experiencing some vapor-lock issues on his recent trip to Chama, NM, **Ned Madsen** switched his white Monza coupe back to an electric fuel pump.

Terry Kalp is continuing to part out the totaled LM convertible. The drive train has been transfered to the Coupe/Sedan project of Terry's. Parts of the convertible heater were used to rebuild the Coupe/Sedan's heater. Last Sundy Ned helped Terry get the clutch linkage up and working (you can't mix '65 and '66 clutch linkage parts). Rear hubs are next.

Juna Tuna, tinkering, Talk and training

Saturday was Juna Tuna at the Kalp Shop. More than 35 Corvair fans showed up, tinkered, talked and ate. There were eight members of the Oklahoma City club that made the trip and one even brought a Corvair to work on. Mike Dawson and Scott Allison came down from Kansas City.

The weather co-operated with mild temperatures and the Kalp Shop grounds had dried out nicely from rains the week before. Owen Strawn opened up his UltraVan (Corvair powered motorhome) to the many people interested in tours. Owen and many attentive bystanders were treated to a mini-tech session on resealing Powerglide Corvair differentials given by Corvair Master Mechanic Mike Dawson.

One of the projects was Lyle Ackerman's 35,000 mile Corvair that was in for noisy lifters . . . again. It had been worked on it at a previous Tuna for the same problem. Found two push rods in upside down (oil hole in) and replaced several adjusting nuts. A few weeks after the first fix one lifter started clacking again.

With the valve cover off this time the noisy lifter was loose and

it took several turns to take up the clearance. Aeroned was the mechanic on the job so he pulled the rocker and ball and found what is shown in the photo . . . a severely worn pivot ball and rocker. A replacement pair from the Kalp supply of pretested parts and this Corvair was back on the road.

Mark Welte was also involved in a project for his Corvair. He needed some arced slots put in the bracket for the FM converter in his Corsa. Mark had attempted the project by hand with little success. With a little advice from Bernie Strecker and Terry's Mini-mill the curved slots were soon created and the converter mounted back in the Black and Silver Corsa.

Phillip Morgan of OKC drove his white '63 Convertible up to replace the rubber on his engine shrouds. He was assisted by James Ergenbright and Bill Ashlock.

For Juna Tuna MCCA provided the meat for the meal, this time burgers, brats and hot dogs prepared by outstanding cook, Bob Bright. Bob also roasted a bushel of corn ears for the goup. With the outstanding side dishes provided
