Mel Horstman 1925-2014

Melvin Christian Horstman, 89, passed away Thursday, August 21, 2014. Graveside service was Wednesday, at El Paso Cemetery, Derby. Melvin was born to Edwin Christian and Emma Louise Horstman, in Chesterfield, Missouri, January 25, 1925.

Preceded in death by his wife of 67 years, Mary Frances, and brother, Lloyd Horstman. Survived by his sons, Melvin Douglas Horstman (Jean) of Mulvane; Thomas Alan Horstman (Mary) of Arlington, TX; Robert Christian Horstman (Beverly) of Wichita; daughter Mary Jo Jones (Loren David); brother Carl E. Horstman of Brentwood, MO; sister-in-law Floretta Horstman of Balwin, MO.

He had a decorated career with the USAF and retired as a Lt. Col. He was instrumental in the restoration of the B-47 on display at the entrance to McConnell Air Force Base in Wichita. He also worked for Kreonite and English Realty. Mel was a member of the 83rd Air Capital Flight Order of Daedalians and Mid Continent Corvair Association. 

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
that were just me and Mel. He always had time to listen to me, answer my questions and offer advice. I enjoyed the time I spent with Mel.

Terry Kalp drove up to Kansas City and rode to the track with Scott Allison. Travis Bolton had picke up the Shark a couple weeks earlier so he could prepare it for the races.

For the Saturday Test and Tune the Shark started out strong as different tires were tested. The the reoccuring problem of a loss of power popped up. It was isolated to the left carb, which was torn down and it was discovered some gasket material was blocking the jet.

Back at full power the Shark turned a best lap of 42.171 with Dominique behind the wheel. Scott turned a personal best lap of 43.787. Best time for Travis was a 42.730.
