

After members have had a chance to review and comment, we will either schedule another work session on them or schedule a membership vote to approve and adopt these proposed By-Laws.

It is intended that the By-Laws be relatively permanent and that they be changed only with serious discussion, advance notice, and vote of the membership. Next Road trip is to Sedan for the Yellow Brick Road Festival on May 23rd, don't miss it.




