

Saturday was the start of the time trials with timed laps at the MPH road course. Scott and the silver Corvair took to the track and Scott had FTD for part of the morning. At the end of the road course session Scott was third over all and he had lent his car to Armen Bader who had FTD for the event. Saturday evening they had 1/8 mile drags. Scott showed his versatility and placed Third in the Drags.

Sunday morning they set up an autocross course on a section of the MPH track and ran the Corvairs. Scott's driving skills shown thru, he won First in this event.

Project Police . . .

Several MCCA members have been getting a lot done on their Corvairs. Lyle Ackerman installed the rebuilt engine in his barn find Corsa only to discover that the clutch was not releasing. A trip to Terry's shop and the driveline was pulled and the sticky clutch repaired. Some problems with the steering were discovered and corrected. Now that the Corsa is road worthy Lyle has purchased new wheels and tires.

Ned Madsen has been busy revamping the interior of the gold sedan. He has replaced the windshield and most of the side glass. All the interior metal is being repainted and the hidden radio is getting modified also.

Mark Welte has gotten the longblock of the turbo engine he is building put together. He and Mark Stevers have been blasting and powdercoating the shrouding for the engine. All the exhaust has been painted with VHT and oven cured.

Gregg Renfro has been busy putting together the Corsa "kit" he purchased from Terry Kalp. They have mated the engine and transaxle. The powertrain has been installed in the car. New U-joints were installed in the half-shafts and the rear suspension has been put back into the car. The shifter and clutch linkage has been connected and all the carbs rebuilt.


