Engine Exotica. Billet Crankshafts.

So you broke another crank in your Corvair race car?

Sport Performance Aviation, LLC (SPA) is now offering a USA-made billet crankshaft for Corvair engines.

They don't come cheap. The price ranges from \$2,500 to \$3,085, depending on whether or not you order it with SPA's billet connecting rods and a set of Clevite bearings. But if you're using a Corvair engine for your home-built aircraft or your Corvair track car, this may be the thing for you.

This crank is a stock replacement and will work with all current components being used. It is made of heat treated Timken 4340 Billet, CNC machined and ion nitrided.

SPA enlarged the radius between the main and rod pins and the face of each throw to .125. This will require chamfering the rod, rod bearings and main bearings. This service is included if you purchase the full kit.

The increase in fillet radius is a critical step in eliminating fatigue-induced cracks. Although stock Corvair cranks are tough, that's where they break under severe usage.

According to SPA, this will be the finest Corvair crankshaft available, show-casing meticulous attention to detail and surface finish.

CORSA BOARD NEWS

President Mike Hall, former President Ken Hand and I are deeply involved in finding replacements for Harry Jensen and Mike McGowan, CORSA's Executive Secretary and Executive Editor.

Harry and Mike are contractors. They've announced they will be retiring at the end of 2017. We are currently seeking proposals from other contractors to replace them.

To expedite the process, we prepared a bid package that contains a list of products and services we expect the new contractors to provide. In addition, we included a draft contract, pricing sheets, and instructions for bidding.

We announced the opening of the bid process on all the major Corvair discussion boards at the end of September. Ken Hand was able to snag a free account on ZipRecruiter and that has resulted in many requests for our bid package. We also reached out to business managers of other well-known car clubs such as the Pontiac-Oakland Club and others.

Over three dozen people have requested (and received) our bid package. But that doesn't mean they will actually bid on the jobs. So far, we are aware of only a few.

Proposals are due at the end of this month, November. We're keeping our fingers crossed....

CORSA Website Improvements

We've improved the CORSA website! You'll see that we have expanded the navigation menu to make things easier to find. We've also added a couple of new pages to the website, including an Officers Directory page and a Support Our Corvair Causes web page. The latter provides an easy way for people to contribute to CORSA and the Corvair Preservation Fund by way of credit card transactions.

Some of the new features are only accessible to CORSA members who have log-in credentials. If you don't have a username and password, you can request one through the website.

CORSA Policies & Procedures

Three policy and procedure revisions have been prepared for approval by the Board. The most important is a revision to the Chapter Plan Procedure, which would enable chapters to maintain an online Corvair discussion board in lieu of the usual newsletter publication requirement. It would also require chapters to pay up the annual \$35 fee by the end of each calendar year as a pre-requisite to CORSA insurance coverage. Voting on the new Chapter Plan Procedure has already begun and it looks like it will pass unanimously.

Other policies and procedures up for revision include the Communique Editorial Policy and Expense Reimbursement Policy. It had been years since these were written. The proposed changes simply reflect our actual practices. The process of preparing ballots and tallying the votes is, unfortunately, quite slow, so it may be a few months before you see any more news about these developments.

Mary Ann's Breakfast Cake

Here's another great recipe from LVCC's First Lady, Mary Ann Stamm! Attention Car Guys: This recipe is easy to bake and mighty tasty, too! You can do it!

2 ½ cups of flour

2 teaspoons baking power

2 cups of sugar

2 eggs (beaten)

½ cup of butter

1 cup milk

½ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl with margarine until it becomes crumbs, then take out 1 cup and set aside. Add beaten eggs, milk and vanilla to crumbs and mix well. Then put into a lightly greased 9 x 13 cake pan. Put the reserved 1 cup of crumbs across the top and sprinkle some cinnamon top. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 45 minutes.

REPAIR CRACKS IN "WOOD" WHEEL

Now you can repair that sport steering wheel as used on many '64-'68 models to near perfect condition. First, thoroughly clean out the crack with alcohol. Now for the miracle cure.

Mix up some 15-minute clear epoxy with some dark brown artist's chalk for color. Now carefully fill in the crack little by little, letting each application dry until you have filled it in completely. Your epoxy patch should protrude a little on the final coat because as the glue dries it will shrink. When the final coat is dry, sand it smooth with

wet or dry 400 grit sand paper. Finally, sand the whole wheel with 600 grit to remove all excess epoxy and any other scratches or damage.

Now, to bring back that original shine to the plastic, polish with Eagle 1 brand plastic polish. When you finish you will have a complete wheel that will look great. I have found that the plastic polish is far better than any kind of clear paint coat. The clear paint will get sticky to the touch on a hot sunny day inside the car, even after it has cured. The plastic polish works best.
