Phil Dally on the Salt Flats

Editor's Note: Phil Dally of Paso Robles, California is one of the morefamous drivers to run a Corvair at the El Mirage Salt Flats. The following article is an adaptation from his page on the V8 Vairs Registry website where he talks about his latest V8-powered Corvair for the street as well as his salt flats car, which was powered by a highly-modified Corvair engine. For the last 12 years I've been campaigning a stock configuration 65 Corsa in the land speed racing world. My best speed is 148.253 mph in 1 1/3 mile at El Mirage dry lakebed here in Southern California. That was with a hot-rodded 140 inter-cooled turbo motor running on gasoline.

I started out running in production classes where nothing but factory body parts may be used. When I started going faster, I felt the need for more safety in an aero package than the stock chin spoiler could provide. I don't know why GM called it a spoiler as it is an air dam.

My fastest pass of 148.235 mph at El Mirage in So Cal was run as an F/BGALT car. F is 2 to 3 liter, B is blown, (no distinction between turbos and blowers) G is gasoline, ALT is the second level of three levels of aero packages allowed.

I am currently building a 500 horse alky T04B turbo motor. The new motor will use methanol so I'll run in F/BFALT. The fun part (besides the 3 liter monster motor) is the Porsche 915 transaxle that I've engineered into the car so that I can have an overdrive gear at Bonneville.

The speeds I'm looking for are 167 mph at El Mirage and 187 mph at Bonneville. Right now, the plan is to shake

down at El Mirage next May or June and make the September USFRA Bonneville event. I don't go to Speed Week in August anymore...it's a zoo.

The record in the classes I'm actually running are all 250+ mph. That is never going to happen, so my goal is to become the world's fastest stockconfiguration Corvair.

Why 167 and 187 mph? The 167/187 numbers were run by Ron Cohn in the seventies. Tom Keosababian is in the Bonneville record book at 173.090 mph. That record was grand-fathered into the Classic (1950-80 cars no electronics) category under Gas Coupe...the lowest level of aero package.

The Cohn records were eliminated when the SCTA-BNI separated gas and fuel. As you can see the rulebook is a dominant factor in land speed. We also have the strictest safety requirements in all of motor sports. As an example I wear a three-layer top fuel fire suit just because of the turbo.

Ultimately, I see a tube-chassis BBC/ADE SuperVair clone in my future. I won't be done with land-speed until I go 167 at El Mirage & 187 at Bonneville and ultimately 200 mph. There have been a couple Corvairs that have run well past 200 but all had V8's in them.

I have the parts to build a 220 cube Corvair engine. As you know there is no substitute for cubic inches. If a billet cylinder head project ever gets off the ground, I will make an attempt at 200 mph. But currently there is no such thing as a modified stock Corvair cylinder head that could support 220 cubes at 8K+ rpm.

Every possible combination of vehicle races in land speed. From mine to Danny Thompson and his dad's Chal-

lenger II with everything in between. I have a friendly competition going on with my buddy Frank Sloan and his Cosworth Vega. We run just about the same speeds and he is winning with a one mph advantage right now. I invite you to meet us at Bonneville next Sept.

There is only one place in the world you can see and hear a twin big block streamliner going by at 450+ mph. Bonneville is a car guys bucket list item. There are currently a half dozen 500 mph efforts underway. First one to 500 wins!!!

LVCC MEETING NOTES May 24, 2017

Attendance: Steve Hurst, Allan Lacki, Larry Lewis, Scott Oberholzer, Jerry Moyer, Ed Prescott, Fred Scherzer, Dennis Stamm and Dick Weidner.

President Dennis Stamm called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM and Secretary - Treasurer Dick Weidner read the minutes of the previous meeting. Dick also gave the treasury report. A motion was made to approve the minutes and treasury report as read, and the motion was seconded and approved by the members in attendance. The club currently has \$1,253.66 in its checking account.

Old Business: At one of our previous meetings, Ed Prescott described a howling noise coming from the rear of his resurrected 1965 Corvair Corsa. Dennis Stamm and Fred Scherzer suggested that one or both of the rear axle bearings may have corroded during the years when Ed's car was in storage. Tonight, before the meeting began, Steve Hurst took a test drive in Ed's car and confirmed that the noise certainly does seem to be coming from one of the rear axle bearings. (Steve is a professional auto mechanic and ex-oval

track racer). Up until now, Ed wasn't sure that the axle bearing was the source, but he has already ordered a new bearing assembly from Clarks and will be installing it soon.

Wanted! Steve Hurst said he needs an oil pump and a pair of 140 exhaust manifolds for the engine he is rebuilding. Dennis Stamm said he would check his supply of used Corvair parts to see if he can find the parts Steve needs.

Obtained! Scott Oberholzer is collecting parts for building a Kelmark V8 Corvair. He recently ordered and received a new master cylinder for the hydraulic clutch assembly that was originally provided in the Kelmark kit. To provide power for his car, Scott has his eyes on a Buick 3800 V6 engine that is up for sale.

Jacktown Flea Market Report: Scott talked about his visit to the April flea market at Jacktown, east of Bangor, PA. The flea market is conducted by the Blue Mountain Antique Gas and Steam Engine Association and entry is free. Vendor wares include heavy duty machinery and tools as well as other mechanical hardware. There are also a variety of antique engines on display.

Show and Tell: Dick Weidner passed around his copy of "Corvair SAE Papers" - a complete collection of technical articles written by Chevrolet engineers Kai Hansen, Bob Benzinger, Frank Winchell, Alex Mair, R.E. Thoreson, J.O Brafford and Bob Cotter. These men were instrumental in the design and engineering of the Corvair. Copies of this interesting book are available from Clark's Corvair Parts.

Corvair Society of America Update: Al Lacki announced that CORSA is in final negotiations with contractors who will take over from Harry Jensen and Mike McGowan when they retire later this year.

Reminiscing: Fred Scherzer, Dennis Stamm and Dick Weidner talked about cruising the streets of Lehigh Valley back when they were in their teens. Places to hang out included Pixie's, the Allentown Fairgrounds, the Castle Garden Ballroom, and the Dorney Park arcades. Dorney Park also had a 1/5 mile oval track where midgets, Sportsmen and Late Model modified cars raced. The track was opened in 1938 and closed in 1986, a victim of rising insurance costs.

LVCC Merchandise: Dick Weidner reported that he has 57 LVCC license plates in stock. They are available for \$3 apiece. Dick also said he has a number of CORSA Tech Guides in stock and they are available to LVCC members at a deeply discounted price.

Then Brian took Bea's car out for a ride. The speedometer indicated that the car was traveling only 6 MPH. He did a double take and noticed that the speedometer and tach dials were reversed!

So, out came the instrument panel

again. Brian installed the dials in their proper spots and now all is well. Who knew the dials were interchangeable?

By the way, Bea's Corsa is now licensed, registered and insured. I had the pleasure of test driving it and it's a really sweet car! Allan Lacki

OIL FILLER PIPE LEAKS by Rit Rittenhouse

Editor's Note: The following article is published in the 1996 CORSA Tech Guide Supplement.

If you're using a stock oil filler cap, it's probably leaking oil fumes and making your engine compartment messy. To check it, cut off the toe of an old white sock and put it over the oil filler pipe and cap, securing it in place with a rubber band at the bottom. A white rag or Kleenex will also work. If the cap is leaking, the sock will turn brown within minutes (black if you don't change your oil often). Of my two cars, one turned color immediately, the other took nearly 100 miles of driving, but both were eventually saturated with oil. I replaced the paper discs (on the underside of the cap) with a circle of 1/16" cork/rubber gasket. Now my stocking stays white and my engine stays clean.

AIR CLEANER GASKET

We all know that the original gasket between the air cleaner horn and the carburetor top eventually swells up and sags until there is no air seal, which lets dirty air get sucked into the engine.

Every PH-4 oil filter we throw away has two high temperature rubber oil seal rings at the top. Remove the small of the two rings and you will find that it fits snuggly on the air cleaner horn and makes a perfect seal.



CORVAIR COOKING CORNER! Real Italian Spaghetti Sauce

This recipe is from Joan Lacki's mother in-law, Jennie Biondo, whose parents came from Sicily in the early 1900s.

Gather the following items for making spaghetti sauce:

- One big cooking pot.
- One clove of garlic. A "clove" is one of the several pieces that make up the garlic bulb. The piece shown on the left side of this photo is the "clove".
- One 28 ounce can of Italian-style tomatoes. Mom used Progresso-brand whole tomatoes, complete with seeds. Before dumping them into the pot, she would strain-out the seeds using a strainer just like the one shown in the photo.



Salt & pepper.

Prepare the ingredients as follows:

1 clove of garlic fried in 2 or 3 tablespoons of oil. Low gas. Watch carefully. Just a couple of minutes then discard. Here's the secret to doing it right:

- Cut the clove of garlic into thin slices before frying it.
- Fry the garlic in the bottom of the cooking pot.
- Fry the garlic slices just until they turn a light golden color.
- Never, never, never burn the garlic! If it turns brown, throw it out, clean the pot, and try again!
- The idea here is to infuse the cooking oil with taste. So, after frying the garlic, Mom used to strain the slices of garlic out of the oil and then discard them.

Add:

- 1 can of Italian tomatoes, strained.
- 2 cans of tomato paste.
- 1 teaspoon of salt.
- Sprinkle some black pepper and salt to taste
- 2 1/2 cans of water, using the large tomato can.

Bring to a boil.

Then lower to simmer.

 Add whatever meat you like to the pot. (Meatballs, sausage, pork - or nothing at all.

Simmer slowly for three hours.
