And from the South, you can drive along the Delaware River, admiring the rapids and Pennsylvania cliffs.


Yes, winter is finally over, so roll down the windows and drop the top. Breathe in that clean country air full of wildflowers.

### Quickie Report on the Corvair Museum's Grand Opening

The Grand Opening of the new Corvair Museum on Saturday May 19 was a big success! A huge number of Corvair enthusiasts were there to commemorate this wonderful event.

CPF/CORSA President Mike Hall was the master of ceremonies and Pam Cole cut the red ribbon to commemorate the event. Pam's dad Cecil Cole handassembled the first production prototype Corvair way back in 1959 and then trained the folks on the assembly line. I don't have the statistics, but based on the size of the crowd, I'd say there were a couple hundred people in attendance. It was amazing to see them all pour into the museum after the ribbon was cut.

In addition to Pam, there were other notable people in attendance, including Richard Lentinello of Hemmings Magazine, Tom Keosababian of land speed record fame, and various CPF/CORSA officials including Paul & Mona Bergstrom and several members of the CPF/CORSA Board. Pam gave a speech about her father's experience on the Corvair pilot line and Sonny Balcaen of IECO fame sent in a message which was also read at the ribbon cutting ceremony.

Many of the participants brought their own Corvairs and entered them in the car show in the museum's ample parking lot. The cars filled four aisles in the parking lot and all types and kinds of Corvairs were there. Notable entries included several senior-level concours cars, four mid-engine V8/V6 Corvairs, Mike McGowan's immaculate Devin C, an Ultra Van and many others. Judging was by People's Choice and the results were announced at the banquet on Saturday night.

Hats off especially to CPF/CORSA President Mike Hall, who was the driving force in making the museum a reality, CPF Publicist Eva McGuire, who got the word out to the entire Corvair community, Teresa Miller, who was our official photographer, and to the members of the Prairie Capital Corvair Association who arranged the banquet and managed registration for the event.

#### A Visit to the Bulgari by Al Lacki

On Friday May 25 2018, I had the opportunity to go on a tour of the NB Center for American Automotive Heritage in Allentown, PA. It is owned by Nicola Bulgari, the Italian billionaire businessman of Bulgari jewelry fame.

According to Carol Besler of Forbes magazine, "One of the perks of being a billionaire is the freedom to indulge your passion, and for Nicola Bulgari, that passion is vintage American automobiles. He keeps 150 fully restored cars in seven warehouses at his 21-acre compound in Allentown, Pennsylvania. (There another 60 or so in Rome, which are flown to Allentown when they need repairs.) Most are from the 1930s and '40s, the heyday of American automobile manufacture, and many are Buicks, fully restored to their original condition.

The compound, which I had the opportunity to tour last week, is more than a warehouse for museum pieces. It is a full workshop with a staff of a dozen experts on restoration, from the preservation of old leathers to metal work.

"We authenticate every piece," says Keith Flickinger, curator and head of restoration. "They are reconstructed to the way they were when they came out of the factory." The cars are driven every day on the compound's track, as well as by Mr. Bulgari himself, who visits


five or six times a year."

You may be wondering where the NB Center for American Automotive Heritage is located in Allentown. It's not far from the Iron Pigs stadium. Although it's not open to the public, Keith Flickinger provides tours of the facility to groups who have made arrangements in advance.



# Car Life Technical Correspondence

In the early 1960s, there was a magazine named Car Life. It's editorial policy favored the new American compact cars of that time and Corvairs were often in the spotlight. In addition to feature articles about Corvairs, Corvair owners often sent letters to the editor asking questions about their newly-acquired waterless wonders. Some were very complimentary and some were not. Here is one that appeared in the December 1961 issue of Car Life. Check out the gasoline octane ratings mentioned in the letter!

L.J. Murtaugh writes: In April, I took delivery of a 1961 Corvair Monza with the 98-hp engine and 4-speed stick shift. My Corvair has a compression ratio of 9.0:1. If I use nothing but 106 octane Gulf Crest or 107 octane Blue Sunoco gasolines, I hear no ping or "cackle" from the rear-mounted engine. But if I use regular or a lower octane premium gasoline

I get a lot of "cackle" every time I press down hard on the accelerator pedal.

I hope I can get away from the hi-octane requirements and the erratic idle and the hispeed buck by installing an electronic transistorized ignition system.

<u>Car Life replies:</u> The switch to a transistorized ignition system isn't going to do a thing to modify your car's appetite for high octane fuels. The only thing that will make your car willing to operate without protest on low-

grade fuel is a reduction in compression ratio or a retarded spark setting.

You can, if you like, install a transistorized system anyway, and it may help to the extent of curing that "high speed buck" you mention. However, your difficulties could as easily be caused by faulty carburetion or failing spark plugs and we suggest that you concentrate on those items. The ignition system used has little if any effect on octane needs.

### May Meeting Notes

We held our May membership meeting on Wednesday, May 23. Rich Green, Steve Hurst, Al Lacki, Larry Lewis, Jerry Moyer, Scott Oberholtzer, Dale Parkhurst, Fred Scherzer, Dennis Stamm and Dick Weidner were there.

President Dennis Stamm opened the meeting at 7:42 PM and Dick Weidner presented the treasury report and minutes of our April meeting. He received no correspondence from other parties except for Dale Parkhurst's membership application which was duly accepted. The club currently has \$1,524.34 in its checking account.

In April, we discussed the passing of Bob Helt, a highly regarded member of the Corvair Society of America and author of many well-written technical articles for Corvair maintenance and restoration. At our May meeting, Dick brought three of Bob's books for the other members to browse.

Dick also passed around a special pushrod guide plate that Bob had engineered that enables Corvair mechanics to change push rod tube seals without loosening cylinder head bolts. Dick pointed out that the need for such a device is not so great now that everybody uses Viton O-rings in place of the original neoprene seals. Nevertheless, in its day, this was a wonderful invention.

Another item of interest was a copy of the Corvair Performance Handbook written in 1963 edited by Ocee Ritch. Dick brought his copy to the meeting and passed it around. It contains articles written by a number of Corvair performance experts from the early 1960s, including Jerry Titus and others. Don Francisco. It's worth noting that this is not the same book as the popular "How to Hot Rod Corvair Engines" book that has been updated and rereleased by Seth Emerson and the content is quite different.

Al Lacki did a slide presentation with photos he took at the grand opening of the Corvair Museum in Decatur, Illinois. Then Dick Weidner presented a video showing Corvair autocross events from West Coast CORSA conventions.

Steve Hurst talked about his Corvair engine rebuild and Dale Parkhurst talked about resealing the engine on a nice 1965 Corvair convertible that he recently acquired. It's his first Corvair!
