



Car Care: How to pour oil

Eliminate oil bottle "burps"!

Believe it or not, there's a right way and a wrong way to pour oil from a plastic bottle into your car's engine. By holding the container properly, you can actually eliminate those messy gurgles.

Bottle design 101

When performing an oil change, ever notice how oil bottles have an "off-center" spout? It's designed that way to cut down on spills.

Most people think the spout should be on the bottom side of the bottle as you pour. That's wrong. Because after just a few seconds in that position, the bottle will start to "burp" and spurt oil. (...all over your engine tins - the last thing your direct air heater needs. Ed.)



To eliminate the "glug, glug, spurt, spurt," pour with the spout in the "up" position. Yes, that makes it harder to aim, but once you get going, you'll have a smooth stream without any "glugging."

Carburetor Venturi Cluster Checks by Mike Dawson



This is an article about Rochester Model H and HV 1 barrel carbs. It does not matter if they are 60 year old originals or potential reconditioned carburetors, the venturi clusters must be carefully cleaned, inspected and matched in order to maximize performance and mileage. This requires miniature drill bits for both cleaning and checking. They are available as sets, both in standard American and in Metric (under \$10), and I recommend you get both for a larger variety. You also




This photo shows a plugged up idle pickup tube.




Checking main well air bleed.

need American numbered bits (set 1-60) for air bleeds.

ACE Hardware does carry individual bits. These can also be used for drilling out metering jets. Use a micrometer to verify the shanks of the miniature bits for sizing and the flutes for cleaning.

There are different sizes for different years and engines which you can look up, but the main thing is that they match from side to side.

Be sure and straightedge the gasket surface and remember that the main well aluminum insert must be installed with the holes 90 degrees opposite the holes in the main well pickup tube.

The 1960 and 1961 models had some extra bleed holes and odd sizes which are listed (along with all of the above suggested specs) in Bob Helt's book on carburetors, available from Clark's.


