



Corvairs on a Race Track? You bet! We've been doing it more than thirty-five years!

The Northeast Corvair Council, ("NECC") conducts high-speed track events and car shows for Corvair enthusiasts. NECC has been putting Corvairs on sports car tracks each and every year since 1974.



Typical NECC Event. An NECC event usually consists of time trials at a sports car track and a car show at a nearby hotel. The time trials and car show take place on two consecutive days so drivers can participate in both events. Although NECC specializes in time trials, we've done autocrossing and drag racing, too!

Where Does NECC Run? NECC conducts high-speed time trials at Lime Rock Park raceway in the Berkshire Mountains of Connecticut every year. This is the same Lime Rock track that is often featured on the Speed Channel. In addition, NECC usually runs two or



three events at other locations. Here is a list of tracks where NECC has conducted high-speed events:

What's a Corvair? During the 1950s, Chevrolet's VP of Engineering, Ed Cole, dreamed that America could mass produce a series of economical cars and trucks brimming with great features,



like coolant-free engines, four wheel independent suspension, unit body construction, decent passenger space, balanced braking, light steering, low center of gravity and more.

Rear-engine design was the key to the concept. Against all odds, Ed Cole gained approval for his dream car, and the Chevrolet Corvair was born. General Motors produced 1.8 million Corvairs from October 1959 to May 1969.

Can I Bring a Car that is Not a Corvair? What kind of car can I bring to an NECC track event? Can I bring a car that is not a Corvair? At most of our events, the answer is yes!

Although some events are restricted to Corvairs, our starting grid often includes Corvettes, Porsches, Mazdas, Mustangs, Camaros, Mini Coopers and more.

Comprehensive Rules. Safety is NECC's top priority. To drive at a high-speed NECC event, you will be expected to follow our track rules and your car will be subject to a full technical inspection. All drivers are treated equally with respect to safety, tech inspection, and track time.

Detailed rules govern the classification of each car. If you are driving a Corvair, your car's class will depend on its carburetion, ignition, exhaust system, tires, wheels, steering, suspension, and other factors. We also have detailed rules for classifying cars for shows and drag racing.
