Our monthly breakfast, which always takes place on the first Saturday of the month, falls right in the middle of the July 4th weekend this month. Because the members indicated a preference for keeping the breakfast on the schedule for July, not skipping it, we will gather at the Pronto Deli on Ridgedale Avenue in Cedar Knolls at 9 AM on Saturday, July 3.

Stratton is a beautiful place to visit, with lots to see for both motoring enthusiasts and for the family members who don't care a whit for Packards or Panhards. It is not too late to join in. Club VP Brian O'Neill is planning an informal caravan to Stratton on Friday, which we encourage you to join if you lack total confidence in your car. Hemmings Motor News Honors Chevrolet Corvairs New England Concours D'Elegance

In celebration of the 50th anniversary of the marque, Chevrolet Corvairs will be featured at the fourth annual

Hemmings New England Concours d'Elegance, July 18, 2010, at the Stratton Mountain Resort in Vermont. Other featured marques at New England's favorite concours include AMC AMX, Bentley, Buick Roadmaster, Citroën, Lincoln V-12 and Indian Motorcycle.

The weekend begins on Friday, July 16, with a cruise-in at the Hemmings Motor News headquarters in Bennington, Vermont, followed by a rally through the Green Mountains. All collector cars are welcome on the mechanic-supported 45-mile tour up the famous Ethan Allen Highway to start the weekend. The rally ends at the Stratton Mountain Resort.

On Saturday, July 17, Hemmings hosts an all day open car show at Stratton, with awards ceremony in the afternoon. The Cruise-in Spectacular is open to any pre-1986 domestic or foreign car, truck or motorcycle, with the winning cars appearing in the pages of a Hemmings publication. This is annually one of the most interesting gatherings of collector cars in New England. Saturday finishes with an available formal dinner at the Lodge at Stratton, guest speaker to be determined; 2009 featured collector and NASCAR legend Don Miller.

The Concours d'Elegance is held on Sunday, July 18. The concours, an invitation-only show, begins at 10 AM and features some of the rarest, most desirable and best-restored collector cars in the country. The Concours concludes with an award ceremony at 3 PM honoring the winners, who appear in the pages of Hemmings Motor News.

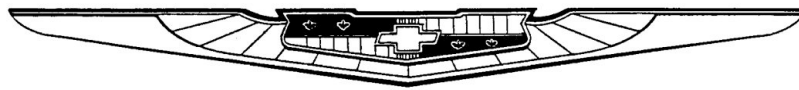

- Upon motion duly made and seconded, the meeting was adjourned.

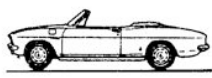
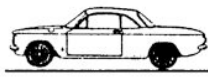
Dealer-Installed Options *by Seth Emerson*

In 1962, my parents traded in their Batmobile – a 1959 Impala 4-door for a sleek 1962 Impala Sport Sedan. The autumn gold car had everything thing they wanted – which wasn't much except power brakes, which they had before on the '59 and a '57 before that. So the dealer told them "Of course we will install those," and the car was dropped off for a two day period for the install.

I drove the car as my first (legal) car, but it was my mother's primary driver and our family car. In 1965, I noticed a little smell down under the dash, and I pulled away the carpet to see a seepage of brake fluid dripping in around the brake push rod through the firewall. I told my dad it needed a rebuilt master cylinder and I picked one up and replaced it. I was a car guy by then, mostly '55 Chevys.

As I finished up the replacement and bled the brakes, I asked my dad why he hadn't had the power brakes installed. We both stood there looking at the firewall – No power brakes. Hmm. Well, my father was just about to make the last of 36 payments on the car, so he brought all the paperwork on the sale, including the printed promise for the power brake installation, back to the Chevy dealer, in the Impala. They sheepishly refunded the cost.

I guess those archaic drums had worked pretty well, since neither of my parents, nor their hot-rodder son, had noticed the lack of assist!
