We also have our quarterly meeting at the Glen Rock Inn this month.

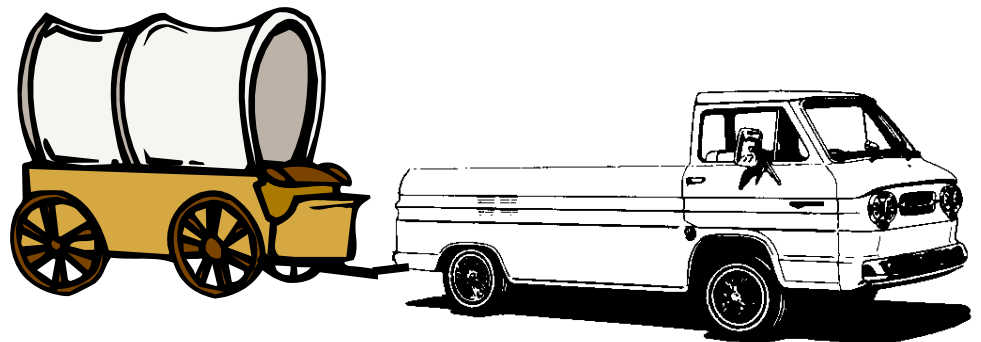
There are a number of Corvair related events this month that might interest you - so check them out.

To exit 165 (Ridgewood Avenue exit), take East Ridgewood Avenue for approximately 2 miles to Maple Avenue, turn left onto Maple Avenue, travel south through 3 traffic signals, make right turn at the 4th signal (Rock Road), go over the 1st railroad tracks to 2nd street (Glen Avenue), the Inn is on the corner of Glen Avenue and Rock Road.

ROUTE 4

Route 4 to Route 208 North, travel approximately 2 miles to Maple Avenue exit (Glen Rock, Ridgewood), travel approximately 1 mile to 2nd traffic signal (Rock Road), make left onto Rock Road, go over the 1st railroad tracks to the 2nd street (Glen Avenue) on left, the Inn is on the corner of Glen Avenue and Rock Road.

Route 80 to Route 17 North, to Route 4 West to Route 208 North. Follow directions above.

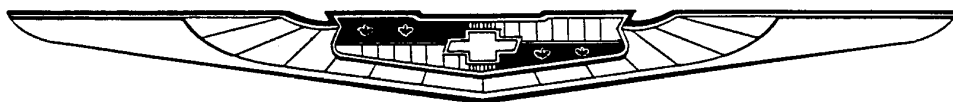
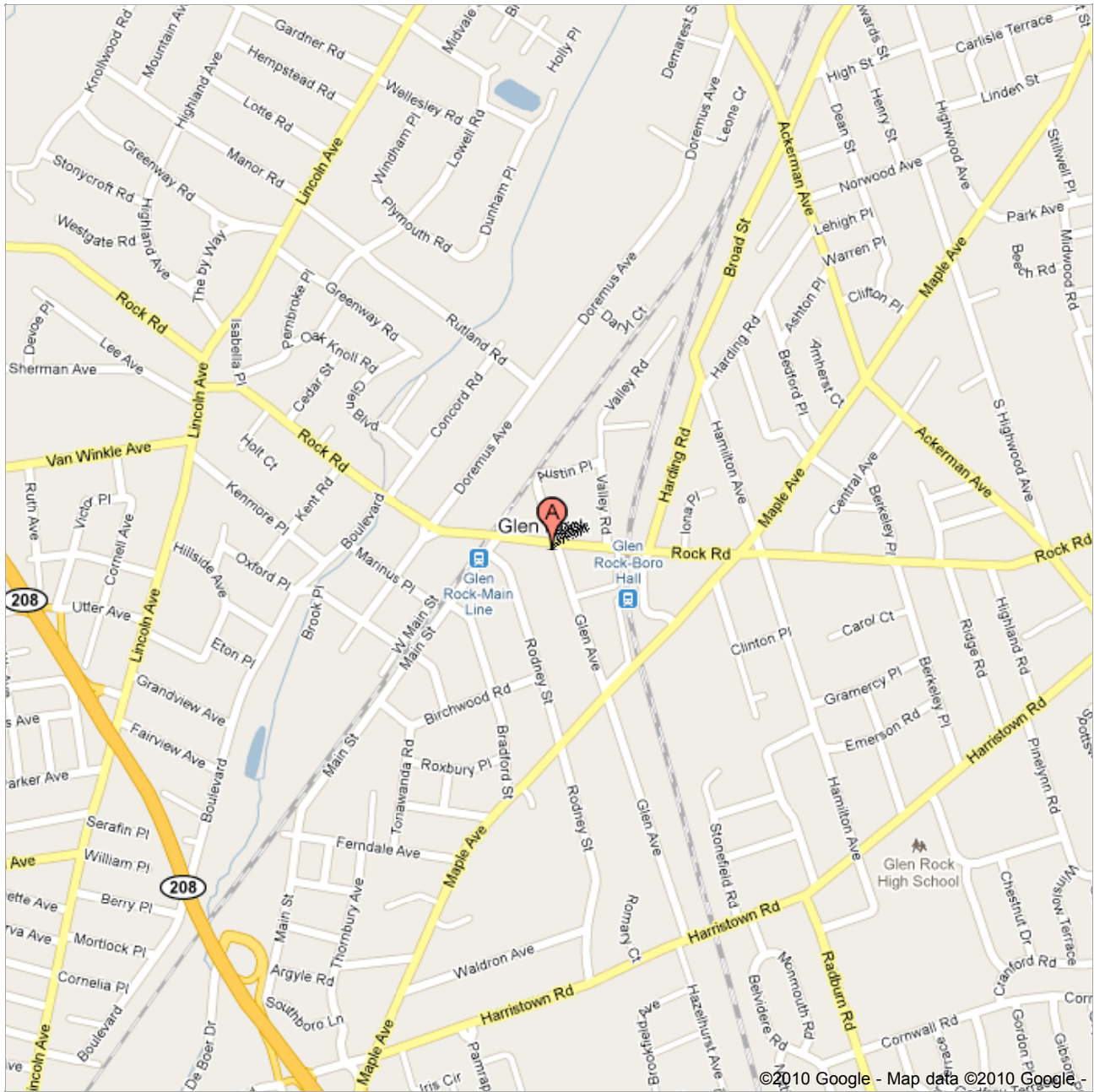


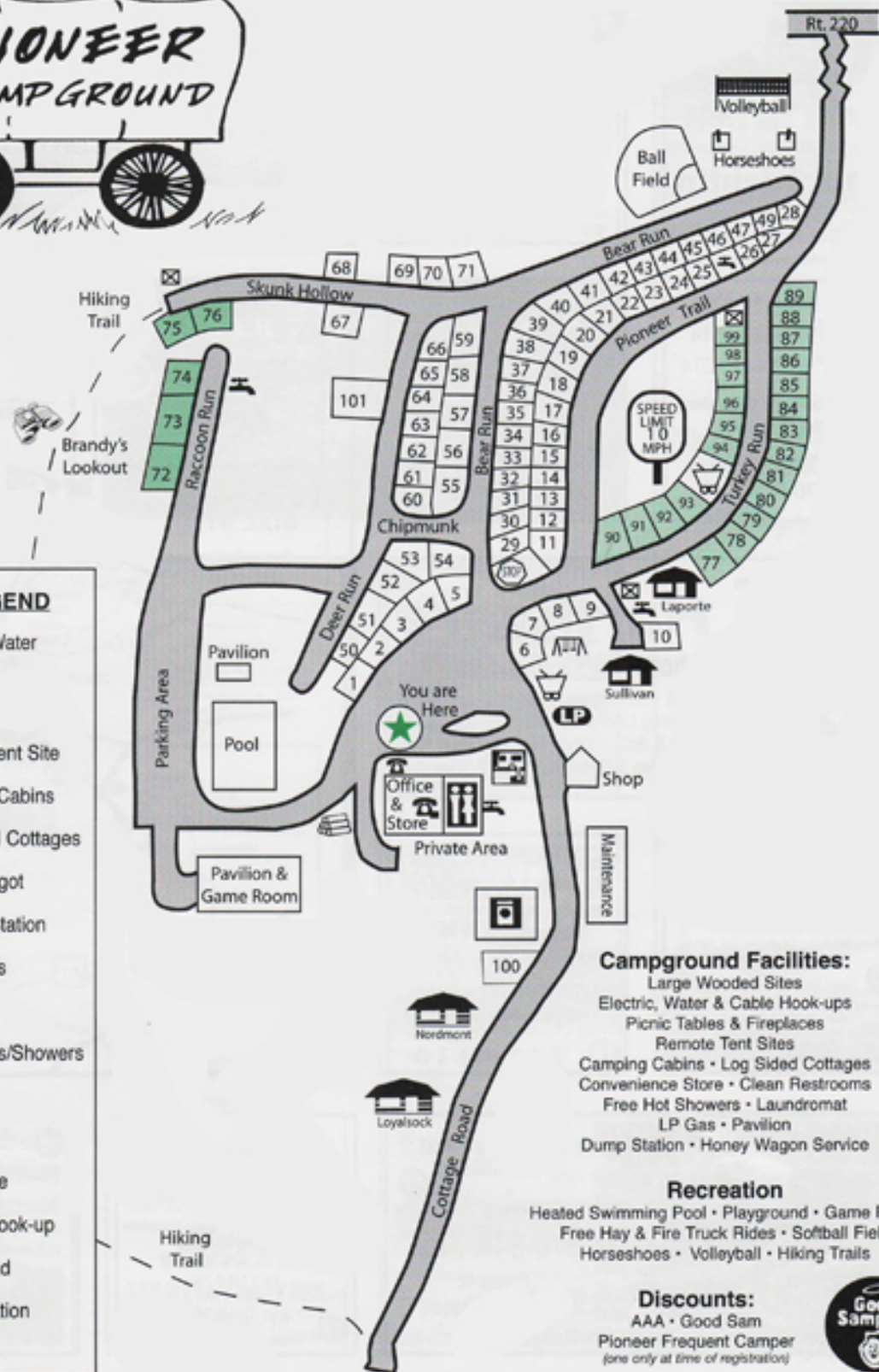
