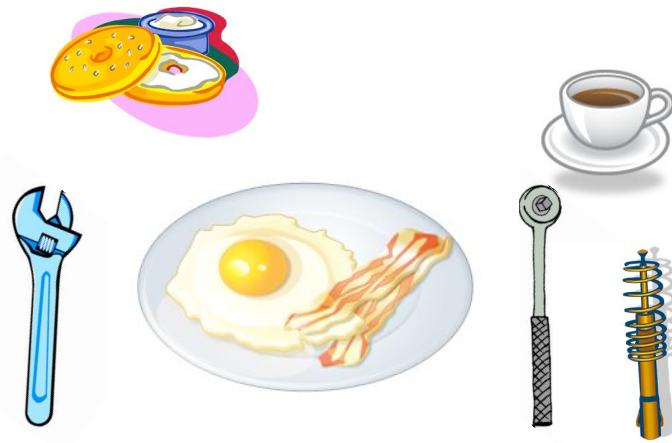
We will have a tech session this month a week following our breakfast meeting at the "Deli".

Fall Roll Out Car Show by Ron Peles

The Fall Roll Out car show in Reigelsville, PA, right along the Delaware River, takes place on Sunday, November 7. The Fall Roll Out is FREE. You must, however, have a pre-1990 car, e.g. Corvair is good, and you must get there early to get in. I plan on getting there at 7:00 a.m. Late show cars end up on the streets. Late means 7:30 a.m.

They have a hot breakfast at the Masonic Lodge, next door. They have a big 50-50 -- one year it was \$3,000! They get over 1,000 show cars, and a flea market rings the perimeter of the show field. Cars are parked first come first served.

It's a rain or shine or snow. But usually the weather is beautiful with all the leaves turning. To get there, go over the Reigelsville bridge from Pohatcong Twp., turn right at the light, then its down on the right side -- show cars are directed in.

Spectators not arriving in show cars pay to get in.

*The 2010 **Fall Foliage Tour** began right on time (9:30 AM) at the Sloatsburg Rest Area on the NY Thruway. No trouble getting cars lined up since the "Tour" consisted of only Tim Schwartz's late model coupe and the author's early convertible. None the less, the cars got more than a few thumb's up and favorable glances on the 50 mile ride to Port Jervis. Mother Nature certainly cooperated with a wonderful, crisp, and sunny Fall day.*

Along the way, the Tour stopped at the Route US 84 overlook (see picture) just outside (and above) Port Jervis. What a view! Of course, the cars were only at a rest for a few moments and visitors came over to chat and ask questions. One fellow even diverted off Route 84 just to get out of his car and take a closer look.

*Then it was onward to Port Jervis and the historic Gillinder Glass Factory. At Gillinder, the **Tour car** count doubled since Ron and Gloria Peles and Joe and Helen Maurella drove their vehicles there direct. It was an impressive sight! Corvairs were well represented. The people count went up to eight (8) loyal NJACE members when Brian and Roberta O'Neill arrived.*

*Next year, Gillinder Glass will celebrate their 150th year of existence. Our guide, Claire, is the great-great-great-great (did I miss a "great"?) granddaughter of the founder. Claire gave us a "great" tour. The factory currently specializes in the making of glass runway lamp covers. These are made to rigid DOT standards for color, shape, and surface quality. Gillinder also makes custom lense covers and specialty glass items for the military. The Gillinder tour consists of friendly live demonstrations of **glass blowing** and glass pressing performed by artisans. We saw beautiful bowls and other handmade glass items being made. Sue Gillinder came by to personally welcome us and share some of the history of the facility.*

The group then did some gift hunting (with success) in the Gift Shop. The shop contains hundreds of beautiful handmade glass (and some wood) items. Decisions...decisions.

We then did a photo-op with our cars (see picture). Sarah of Gillinder Glass also took a picture or two and I wouldn't be surprised if it appears on their website or other publication.

*The Tour then drove down Route 6 to historic **Milford, PA** for lunch at the Dimmick Inn. Bob and Sue Marlow met us there bringing the NJACE crowd to ten. The Dimmick was the first choice in the planning stage but parking availability initially favored the Tom Quick Inn which is located just up the street. The Tom Quick closed unexpectedly, however, on October 7th. Though on short notice, the Dimmick folks set us up in a front room and a hearty lunch was enjoyed by all. After lunch, some of the group took in some of the many shops in the quaint and inviting town of Milford.*
