The party plans are a repeat of last year when the food and festivities were *fabulous* but the weather was lousy. This year, we have the same great time planned and we have placed our order for much better weather.

If you're coming there are a couple of things you need to do. First, you need to RSVP. If you are planning to attend the party we need to know and we need your commitment for the per-person cost of \$25. So, please, contact club president Brian O'Neill to sign up. Second, you can't just wander in to Picatinny Arsenal. It's absolutely necessary that you provide Brian O'Neill your name and the name of anyone coming with you. You need to make sure that each person has good photo identification with them. You have to have the registration and insurance card for your vehicle, and you have to know where you're going. The gate personnel will inspect your vehicle.

You'll need these documents at the front gate entrance. The guards there will have a list of everyone who is authorized entry for the party. That's why it's absolutely necessary that Brian has your information no later than Wednesday, January 13. If you just show up at the front gate without prior arrangement things will be very difficult.

Okay, but how do you find Picatinny Arsenal and the correct entry gate? That's easy, just follow I-80 westbound to Exit 34B for NJ Route 15 north toward Jefferson/Sparta. (If coming eastbound use Exit 34 and follow the signs for Route 15 north.) The Picatinny gate will be on your right just a short distance north on Route 15.

Once you are at the gate, your destination is the Cannon Gate Conference Center, locally known as the club.

Okay, now you're inside Picatinny. How do you get to the club? Well, after you come through the gate continue straight on the main road and as you come up to a blinking yellow traffic light bear to the right. Go on that road for only a short distance and bear left. The club will be a short distance on your left. Please don't wander around on the Arsenal. You'll attract attention and they'll call Brian.

If you wish to participate in the Gift Game, please bring a wrapped gift valued at no more than ten to fifteen dollars. Just remember the gifts you bring should be unisex. Be creative in the gifts, think outside the bottle!

If you are not familiar with the Gift Game, it goes as follows: Each participant brings a wrapped gift.
