This year's WPCC Spring

Clever Memorial Tuneup" in
recognition of WPCC's founder
and inaugural chapter
president, was held on
Saturday, June 3rd at
Adzema's Pharmacy off Perry
Highway in Ross Township.
The event was once again
hosted by WPCC member
Zeke Braun, whose family
owns the pharmacy, and led



by Corvair mechanical expert and WPCC member John Sweet. Thanks John, for sharing your knowledge.



The weather was perfect, warm and sunny, and unofficial figures accounted for about a dozen or so Corvairs and roughly 25 enthusiasts in attendance. Light snacks were provided, along with an assortment of

Corvair Tuneup Kits and items either preordered or available day-of for purchase.

John's primary tutorials this year focused on overviews of harmonic balancers and oil coolers – what they are, what they do, general



maintenance, and cross-year compatibility. The so-called evolution of

these items has to leave you wondering if Chevrolet's strategy was based on designed-in-engineering improvements, trial & error, or simply cost-saving...but that's for another discussion.

Following the "classroom" session and inevitable QnA, members splintered off to check on each other's vehicles for some light wrenching assistance as needed. New members Scott and James Bussard garnered a bit of extra attention as they arrived in a Myer's Manx dune buggy and a 1967 Monza, the latter of which reportedly struggled to make the trip from the Beaver Falls area. Turned out the engine in their recently-acquired Monza was suffering from some internal issues beyond what could be repaired in this setting. Nonetheless, members pitched in to successfully help address enough top-end items for them to make the return trip home under the Corvair's own power – Scott later commented that, even though the motor blew oil all over the engine compartment, his son James said that the car never drove better or felt stronger. Scott and James have since moved forward w/ dropping a new engine into their Monza.



It was also great to see WPCC's own Corvair elder statesman, Bill Artzberger, who arrived towards the end of the event with his son Bill, in Bill Sr's. 1967 custom Monza. This is a Corvair that Bill had restored many years before, and turns out this was the $1^{\rm st}$ time it had been out of the garage in almost that long – it still looked great. Bill posed with members for pictures, and was in great spirits as usual.

The tuneup wrapped up around 2:30. All in all, an excellent Corvair day.





WPCC Meeting Minutes

Call to order

A meeting of Western Pennsylvania Corvair Club was held at the North Park Clubhouse, Gibsonia, PA. on Tuesday, May 23, 2017. Officers in attendance included, President, Jim Steigerwaldt; Vice President, Don Cekus; Treasurer, Darlene Kady; and Secretary, Jim Weppelman. Board of Directors present included; Les Walter, Don Bakat er, Pat Greenwald, Steve Puskas, Bob Heiber, and Jim Madden. 26 members in all, with 7 Corvairs in the parking lot.

Approval of minutes

President Jim Steigerwaldt called the meeting to order. Chuck Chieffo motioned to accept minutes of last meeting, as published in the March, 2017, Vair Street Journal. Jim Steigerwaldt seconded.

Reports

New members Alex Macek, and her boyfriend Mark, were on hand with her 1964 Monza coupe that is supposed to be Don Yenko's wife's car. Also new member Chuck Chieffo was on hand.

Jim Steigerwaldt relayed a story of him losing a large check, and being found and returned to him, with the finder asking for a date!! 
