the Prez Sez...

The Prez sez,

Well, our club's Executive Board and Board of Directors met in early February with the main purpose of setting the agenda of events for

2016. HOWEVER, yours truly set a monkey wrench into the program after two issues were brought to my attention that I felt needed to be addressed. The first being our chapter By-Laws, and the second being our chapter's Incorporation papers.

It turns out the by-laws, after being found by Don Cekus, had not been revised since 1973, which is the timeframe we believe our club was founded. After many hours of reviewing these "old" by-laws, I presented both boards with suggested amendments – from there a number of additional corrections, updates, and/or additional amendments were made. After several attempts to come up with the correct amendments, I believe we have succeeded, and the amended By-Laws will be presented for a vote at the March meeting.

Re: the incorporation papers, the first problem here was actually locating them. Why does this matter? Well they are 1st very important to the club, and should be routinely passed from the "old" to

the "new" regime. But probably more important now, is that since we are taking on the awesome task of sponsoring the 2018 NATIONAL CONVENTION, we need to have crossed all our "T's" and dotted all our "I's. Having said that, we started the task of finding the papers. Several inquiries were made of present and past members with "No Luck". With the help of your Secretary JAMES WEPPELMAN, (I love that), a letter was sent to the Lehigh Valley Corvair Club asking for assistance - in this regard, a "Big Shoutout" and a bigger thanks is due to LHCC Secretary AL Lacki. Without getting into further detail, I have started the process of obtaining a copy of our chapter incorporation document, which was on 02/05/1979. Further changes have to be made to it in order to establish WPCC as a "Tax Exempt" organization both at the State and Federal level. This will take some time and money, but a plan, I think, is well worth our combined efforts.

As for this year's agenda, we discussed several events and activities which I think you will enjoy, IF you attend. These events can be found on our VSJ Activities Calendar.




Heiber Holiday Roadtrippin

presence. Aren't we lucky we found each other? © One additional note of interest on this below...


<u>Clark's 2016 Supplement...</u>Got mine in the mail a few weeks back. Is it just me or is this like getting the old Sears Christmas Catalog before the holidays? So many parts I'd love to have.

<u>New Year's Resolution – One Down!...</u>I finally finished reading "Unsafe At Any Speed" this past month. This has been on my list of Corvair "to do's" for several years as I've wanted to get beyond the "blind faith" disdain for Ralph Nader within the Corvair community and better understand 1st hand

his purpose and perspective at the time this book was written (published in 1965).

As most of us are aware, prevailing opinion within Corvair circles is that Nader was a "Corvair hater" based on his book's notorious "attack" of the early-model Corvair, and specifically its swing-axle suspension, as a "one-car accident". While the

book's opening chapter does, in fact, focus on the early model Corvair's designed-in suspension issue, the



greater reality is that Nader's book presented an indictment of the American automotive industry as a whole for their focus on profit over safety. In fact, the book's remaining 7 chapters go on to target every American auto manufacturer, as well as a multitude of government agencies and a long list of vehicles, for their clear profit-first business strategies at the known expense of the consumer.

Have my opinions changed? Maybe a little. From our perspective, we know how the story ends...the NHTSA is founded, designed-in safety features are now federally regulated, the Corvair is exonerated, etc. In these regards, it's fair to say Nader's efforts are actually worth applauding – if not him, someone else would have pressed the issue. For what it's worth, I found Nader's research to be sufficiently thorough and his findings and expectations reasonable. In fact, his tone is one of extreme exasperation that so little priority was placed on consumer safety when corrective opportunity was so readily available. Ultimately, I have no idea how many of our chapter members, or Corvair enthusiasts in general, have actually read "Unsafe At Any Speed", but, for those curious about the deeper story, I would recommend it if you have the opportunity.



WPCC New Member Welcome...Zeke Braun

My family has owned and operated Adzema Prescription Pharmacy and lunch counter since my Grandfather, Robert Adzema, first set up shop just a few blocks from the current location in 1959. My grandfather was the kind of person who would much rather fix problems himself than call

someone. Utilizing this knowledge during the 70's and 80's he would purchase broken Corvairs, then disassemble and reassemble them into working cars. It was during this time that my family owned 16 Corvairs which could be seen sitting behind the store during the day.

However sadly as he aged his ability to maintain our fleet dwindled as none of his children had the mechanical knowledge or drive fix the Corvairs. Through the late 80s into the 90s the number of cars fell to the point that only two remained. In 1995 as my Grandfather moved to Myrtle Beach he gifted the two remaining Corvairs to his children. The 1966 red Corsa 4 speed went to my uncle, Jay Adzema, and the 1965 blue Monza auto was given to my mother, Amy Adzema. The Corsa was driven by my uncle on and off for several years until his skill with a manual lead to him blowing both the clutch and the engine. Several years later he would sell the car leaving my family with only one.

The Monza sat in a garage for 16 years before I came along to bring it back to life. cover downstairs somewhere. It was a cheapie, and so big I would have to use those tie downs to get it to stay on the car. – Kurt Foltz, Ross Township



This Month in Corvair History...The 1954 General Motors Motorama rolled into San Francisco. This event featured the debuts of such novel concept cars as the Chevy Nomad and the original, frontengine, Chevrolet Corvair concept car.



A Trio of Corvette Motorama Cars for 1954

The Corvettes for '54

For the 1954 Motorama shows, General Motors Styling Section created not one but three distinct Corvette dream cars: the Corvair fastback coupe, the Nomad station wagon, and the convertible coupe. All three shared some recognizable Corvette features, such as the front grille and fascia treatment, but were given certain unique styling elements in order to set them apart. The Corvair and the convertible coupe maintained the same wheel base and overall length as the 1953 Corvette. The Nomad wagon had a longer wheelbase and was approximately two feet greater in overall length.

The Convertible Coupe

The Corvette Convertible Coupe was the closest in styling to the production model. It was painted in a muted yellow hue and it's main distinctive was a fiberglass removable hardtop that gave the sports car new "all-weather utility" as touted in the Motorama brochure. This feature would appear on production models as an aftermarket accessories beginning in 1955 and would officially become an option for the 1956 model year.





The Nomad

The Nomad combined the sleek styling of a sports car with the versatility of station wagon. Built with a "glass fiber reinforced plastic" body, the Nomad was two-door with space for six passengers. It was built on modified 115-inch Chevrolet wagon chassis to give it the extra space necessary for this seating capacity. The Nomad also had an

electrically operated rear window that automatically retracted into the tailgate when unlocked or could be remotely controlled by a button on the instrument panel. The Nomad was most lauded of the three Corvette dream cars for 1954. A larger version of this concept appeared for the 1955 model year and the nameplate would appear on concepts in the late 1990s and 2000s.



The Corvair

The <u>Corvair dream car</u> was an experimental two-passenger fastback. It was built with a fiberglass body and was touted as a "new aerodynamic design" for the closed sports car class. The streamlined roofline swept back into the jet exhaust-type rear opening. It was originally a ruby-red color for the New York City Motorama in January but had repainted in a lighter hue by the time of the Los Angeles show in March. Sluggish sales of the 1954 production model Corvette deterred GM management from moving forward with the fastback coupe. Hence, the Corvair was the only one of the trio of designs not to make it

to production in some form. Of course, the nameplate would be recycled later for the infamous <u>1960 Corvair</u> rear-engined compact car.

<u>ADD NOTE:</u> The Corvair was at all the '54 Motorama show locations. It was dark red when it appeared at New York but pale green everywhere else. There are two theories: 1) That it was repainted & re-trimmed between shows 2) That there were two cars built. There's no proof at all that 2 were built though. Not even one of them has ever surfaced but at least one relica has been built. Because of the Corvair name I collect everything about the 54 Vair and have an actual hood emblem! - *Corvair Historian Dave Newell*



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
