Tinkertown Visit July 19, 2025







My first tour of Tinkertown by Joel Yelich

On the morning of Saturday July 19th, I drove down Hwy 14 from Santa Fe to meet up with some other members of the club at Tinkertown in Sandia Park. I had driven by the place many times over the decades on the way up to Sandia Peak, but this was my first visit. After a nice drive down the Turquoise Trail, I waited in the crowded parking lot trying to time the arrival of the others from Albuquerque. Eventually I heard the sound of a flat six as Steve and RIta Gongora's 1964 Corvan pulled into the lot. A moment later Greg Nelson appeared. We made our way to the museum as Steve explained that they were good friends with Carla



Ward, the wife of creator and self taught artist, Ross Ward, who had passed away in 2002. Ross began collecting and meticulously crafting miniature circus figures in the early 60s, which evolved into a traveling exhibit. In 1981, he started building the museum's permanent structure from 50,000 glass bottles, officially opening it in 1983.

We were welcomed in by Carla at the entrance as Greg produced a bag of quarters for the first mechanical music display. Viewing the eclectic mix of dioramas, displays of curios and historic minutia was quite enjoyable. Greg disappeared down one of the corridors of bottle walls while Steve and I commented about the bayonets, wild west miniature displays, some in motion, and a pair of size 22 shoes from Louie Moilanen, aka "Big Louie", once billed as the world's tallest man, standing at 8'4" and weighing 430 lbs. One could spend hours looking at the details, especially the circus display. Eventually we came to the Theodora R, a 35-foot antique wooden sailboat docked in the middle of the Cibola National Forest, far from any major body of water. The 1936 English-built vessel was purchased in 1981 by Fritz Damler, Ross's brother-in-law. Damler spent ten years circumnavigating the globe, covering 80,000 miles before concluding his voyage in 1991. Unable to sell the boat, Damler, at Ross's suggestion, had the Theodora R trucked to Tinkertown Museum in 1994.

After some discussion of an unusual solar sensor tripod in the middle of the museum, I exited out to



tour the wild west village. Responding to calls of my name, I then returned to the main entrance and we all were given a wonderful private tour of the adjoining residence by Carla. Ross' art studio inside is still filled with an amazing collection of paintings. The hidden courtyard

has a mural Ross painted in 90 minutes.

I was invited to join the group for lunch up the road at the Doc

Long Picnic Area now including Lupe and Jim Arellanes. I'm thankful to Steve and Rita for providing some great sandwiches from Great Harvest Bread at Montgomery and Juan Tabo and sweet melon slices. Before saying goodbye, we discussed having a garage tour up at my place in Santa Fe this fall and I'll make chile con carne for everyone.

We are all constantly on the lookout for Corvairs, even models and toys. So, when I heard rumors that Matchbox is making a 1961 Rampside model, I spent some idle time trying to see what I could find.

The photo to the left was sent to David Huntoon. He is in contact with the current owner of Bill Reider's car. The car now resides in England. This is what Dave says:


Just got this, Bill's Corvair. Out for a 80 mile trip to a show in England. Stewart Rockliffe, ran great!
