
DO YOU LIKE

We are a chapter of The Corvair Society of America, better known as CORSA, established in 1971 and dedicated to the preservation of Corvairs cars and trucks from the decade of the 1960s. CORSA is among the largest single-marque car clubs, and its members encompass an incredible variety of interests, from pure "restoration" types who spend thousands of dollars and hours making their Corvairs look like a perfect showroom model, to serious race drivers who spend thousands to prepare their Stinger Corvairs for racing competition, as well as many members who just want to keep driving their Corvairs as everyday reliable, pleasant and economical transportation.
