1st Newsletter: Story by Steve Gongora

This was the first cover of our CNM newsletter. (We are now at issue 581). It was drawn by our talented and one of the first members of the club, Mark Morgan. Mark was about to go in the Navy and he was dedicated to getting this club off the ground. Our first official meeting was at a garage on Bridge and Isleta. Duncan Puett was an automotive mechanic and made his place available for the first meeting. A friend of mine, Bill Seno told me about a group of guys getting together for a Corvair meeting and asked me if I was interested in joining him. I owned a 1965 Corvair Monza at the time and attended this meeting. What I found out later was that Bill Seno was a roommate of Mike Stickler. Mike and Brenda met and married. That is another story. From that first meeting, there were priorities set in motion if this club was to get off the ground. First off was to get a sponsor, a stable place to meet and get more members. Ed Black Chevrolet stepped up to the plate and offered not only their sponsorship but a meeting place in the

basement of the used car department. We were assigned a sales representative as a point of contact and we were off. Pete Colburn and I worked on the original logo for the club and the color scheme. We went to Weldy Screenprint and silkscreened license plates for our beauties. The dealership helped in spreading the word about our club, and somehow word got around and we grew. As soon as we were getting our feet off the ground, there was an oil crisis and we were not able to continue to meet at Ed Black's. Hector Gongora made the House of Covers available for meetings, and we stayed there for a few years until things stabilized with the economy and the dealership. When the time was right we went back to Ed Black's, went through a few sponsors and ended up with a gem of a man named Milton Sanchez. He took us under his wing and even bought a Corvair. As it happens with many things, "All good things come to an end". Ed Black's closed the dealership when they were bought out by Casa Chevrolet. We continued with this arrangement for some time until the dealership said that we could no longer meet there and we had to

find a new home. Our new home became Galles Chevrolet. Our meetings were standardized and we met on the first Tuesday of every month. It was easy to remember because that was the day they tested the emergency broadcast equipment. The sirens used to sound off at noon and it was a great way to remember to go to the meeting. Another standard was the meeting time at 7:30 PM. My memory gets fuzzy and I can't remember when we changed it to Wednesdays. The time remained at 7:30 PM. The tradition was to have the meeting and meet at a restaurant after we were done. The place to go after our meetings at Ed Blacks was Sambo's which later became the Cornucopia. Walmart took over the area and all restaurants disappeared in that area. When we settled at Galles Chevrolet, we would go to the Howard Johnsons and eventually started going to the 66 Diner. They encouraged us and tailored to our needs as it was the perfect place on the "old highway" and vintage cars.

Galles Chevrolet had to move out of their facility as the property was owned by the University of New Mexico. They relocated at Candelaria and University and still made themselves available to the club. The only problem was that the room they gave us was too small for all attendees. President Ray Trujillo had connections with the Highland Senior Center on Monroe and Central and we had a home again. It was a great place and we were content. Management changed and we were on the move. The North Domingo Baca Multi-Generational Center welcomed us and that was our new home. Don't know what happened but we needed another place. By this time, as our Corvair population has aged and the eyesight of many of members has diminished, especially driving at night, it was moved that we change the day and time again. It was thought to make it during the day and on the weekend. By this time the Highland Senior Center was once again available and welcomed us back.

I invite you to turn in your story as you remember it. That way you can validate or correct what I've said. My memory is 50 years older than when I joined the club. As to the future, we are always in need of new members, especially those that can contribute to its longevity. Many changes have come to the club and there are many more changes to come. Please consider what you can offer and help us to make it happen. The time is important now as we host our annual Tri-State event in May. *Steve Gongora*

The **Castañeda Hotel** is a historic <u>railroad ho-</u> <u>tel</u> located in <u>Las Vegas</u>, <u>New Mexico</u>. It was built in 1898 and 1899 by the <u>Atchison</u>, <u>Topeka and Santa Fe</u> <u>Railway</u>, and was operated by the <u>Fred Harvey Com-</u> <u>pany</u> until 1948. After being mostly vacant for many years, the hotel was restored and reopened in 2019. The Castañeda was listed on the <u>New Mexico State</u> <u>Register of Cultural Properties</u> in 1974 and the <u>National Register of Historic Places</u> in 1979 as a <u>contributing property</u> in the <u>Railroad Avenue Historic District</u>. It is located adjacent to the <u>Las Vegas railroad station</u>.



History

In the 1890s, the <u>Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway</u> operated a small frame boarding house called the Depot Hotel where passengers could eat during lunch stops in Las Vegas. In 1898 and 1899, the railroad built a new and much larger hotel, the Castañeda, which was operated by the <u>Fred Harvey Company</u>. The Castañeda was the first of what would eventually be dozens of Harvey hotels along the Santa Fe lines, including the <u>Alvarado</u> in <u>Albuquerque</u>, <u>New Mexico</u>, <u>El Tovar</u> at the <u>Grand Canyon</u>, <u>El Garces</u> in <u>Needles</u>, <u>California</u>, and <u>Casa del Desierto</u> in <u>Barstow</u>, <u>California</u>, among others. The hotel was designed by <u>Frederick Roehrig</u> and officially opened on January 1, 1899. It was named after Pedro de Castañeda de Nájera, who chronicled the 1540 expedition of <u>Francisco Vázquez de Coronado</u> into New Mexico. The cost of construction was \$110,000, plus another \$30,000 for furnishings.

In June, 1899, the hotel hosted then-governor of New York <u>Theodore Roosevelt</u> at the first reunion of the <u>Rough</u> <u>Riders</u>. By the 1940s, apart from a brief boom in train travel during <u>World War II</u>, the hotel was losing money. It was closed by the railroad in June, 1948. The <u>Las Vegas Optic</u> wrote,

The Castaneda has been a center of social activity for the community. Its walls have resounded the oratory of locals and visitors at civic, political and fraternal banquet sessions. Evening-gowned ladies have brushed elbows with smoke-darkened railroaders. Cowboys have perched at the counter alongside eastern dandies. Politicians and salesmen have shared the lobby. Life won't seem the same with the Castaneda closed.

The hotel remained mostly vacant for the next 70 years, but it was saved from demolition by a preservation-minded owner, unlike the Alvarado in Albuquerque. Some of the rooms were sporadically used as apartments, and the hotel bar remained in operation, but most of the building was empty and deteriorating. In 2014, it was purchased by Allan Affeldt, who had previously restored the <u>La Posada Hotel</u> in <u>Winslow, Arizona</u>. Affeldt spent three years and \$6 million restoring the Castañeda and the nearby <u>Plaza Hotel</u>. The Castañeda reopened in 2019.

Architecture

The Castañeda was designed by <u>Pasadena</u> architect <u>Frederick Roehrig</u> and was the first example of <u>Mission Reviv-al</u> architecture in New Mexico, as well as the first Mission-style Harvey house. As such, it served as a prototype for later buildings constructed by the Santa Fe Railway, like the <u>Alvarado Hotel</u>. The Castañeda is a two-story, U-shaped brick building surrounding a central courtyard that opens onto the railroad tracks. A 500-foot (150 m) long <u>arcade</u> wraps around the front and sides of the hotel. The two side wings terminate in curved, Mission-style gables, and there is a tall <u>bell tower</u> above the main entrance.

The interior of the hotel contains about 30,000 square feet $(2,800 \text{ m}^2)$ of space plus a large, uninsulated attic space and partial basements under the north and south wings. The south basement contains mechanical equipment, while the north basement was used for storage. In its original configuration, the hotel's ground floor contained a 108-seat dining room, 50-seat lunch counter, and a newsstand. The second floor housed 37 guest rooms.
