



Greg Nelson's car was making noise from the lifters. The recommendation was to let the car warm up and drive it for at least 30 minutes to quiet it down.


David Huntoon received his new tires. He had a previous order that never came.



Shifter Adjustment on the “Supervan” - Steve Gongora

I'm getting ready to install my stereo system on the van and I needed to reposition the gear shifter to accommodate the display of the stereo. The knob was almost touching the dash. I needed to extend the bottom shaft to make the shifter knob more comfortable and closer to the driver. To do this all you have to do is remove the cover plate over the shifter on the underside of the van to expose the actual shifter mechanism. All these changes refer to the 1964 Forward Control model. Earlier Forward Control models have a different layout underneath. The plate on the '64 is connected with screws. The next step is to remove the screws on the plastic cover which shields the long shifter shaft from the front of the van to the transmission. You have to loosen the hose clamp to allow access to the adjustment nut and bolt. I advise you to mark your beginning starting place so you have some sort of gauge to go by. After I loosened the nut and bolt adjuster, I got in the van and moved the shifter to a comfortable position and crawled under the van to tighten up the adjuster and begin the process of putting things back together.

The changes went without a hitch and now I don't have to reach and move my body forward to get first gear. I should have done this years ago. What a great
