

Cruise and Schmooze Robert and Anne-Mae brought their Corvair powered VW bus and Bill Heil participated for, I believe, his third year in a row.




NMCCC Museum Car Show

The next time you pass through the round-about at the Menaul and 12th Street intersection, take a moment to look at the very tall art piece in the center of the intersection. That is Upton's artwork.



<u>'64 Monza</u>

As mentioned earlier I doubled my efforts to get the '64 Monza ready for the Museum car show. Since the rebuilt mechanical fuel pump lasted less than 5 miles I had to install the electric pump from Clark's. First task was to build new wood block pieces to extend the range of the floor jacks. I had to purchase an extended-reach floor jack to boost the rear of the car high enough to rest on the racing ramps. I sacrificed an old fuel pump and used Clark's bypass plate in the middle section. That was the easy part. Trying to figure out how to orient the fuel pump took two days. Yes, two days. Then it dawned on me. Duh. I thought the hardest part would be routing a power wire from the fuse box. Steve let me examine the setup in his Greenbrier. That helped tremendously. I had to remove the bottom tunnel and then I used a coat hanger fed from below and it popped out just underneath the dashboard. Hallelujah! Then it was simply a matter of attaching a wire to the hanger and pulling it through. Next, I crimped connectors onto the end of the wire and now the pump has power.

Oh, and for safety reasons I pumped out all the gas from the tank and stored it in four portable gas cans. I did not want to catch on fire.





To extend the reach of the floor jack, I

used triple piece wood blocks. I glued and screwed together each of the sections. I had a fuel pump from Clark's Corvair Parts with a 90 degree port. I connected a hose from the gas tank to the fuel pump, then connected it to the fuel line to the engine. I used double floor jacks to lower the car in 1" increments. It took a lot of time but much safer this way.



Trash Day

We had a crew of six this month. However, we split into two groups because there was a charity bicycle ride through the canyon with a police escort. And the escort only moved as fast as the cyclists. I had to turn around,

get on the highway, and get to our mile from the east end. Afterwards Dave and I made the usual pilgrimage to Roots Farm Café. Thanks to the Arellanes family, Robert and Dave. To the right is the Arellanes family with my shadow.

We were treated to a unique and enlightening experience with a tour to Upton Ethelbah's home and art studio. To start the event we sat in Upton's living room so he could hear about each of our lives. He told us of his upbringing which included a stint in the Navy and helping with Native American artists. He was challenged to dive in when he always said that he was capable of doing the art, then was presented with a hammer and chisel and was told to prove it. He kept his first sculpture and brought it out to share with the group. It was amazing. Upton has created art that remains on display at Buffalo Thunder in their lobby, there is work on permanent display at the Museum of Indian Arts & Culture in Santa Fe, and many more too numerous to mention. If you drive at the "round about" at Menaul and 12th, you will see his metal creation in the center. After our gathering in his home we were led to his work area and he shared what tools that are needed to carve the stone and he shared his experience with working with different type of stone from all over the US and the world. His favorite is the Carrara marble stone from Italy. The same stone used for statues created by Leonardi da Vinci. You don't want to miss out if we are privileged to do it again.



Cruising Down Memory Lane

A classic symbol of the '60s has rolled into Flagstaff this week -- the Corvair, a sporty ride that captured that imagination of a generation and was one of the first targets of consumer advocate Ralph Nader.

Corvairs of every color and year are in town while the members of the Corvair Society of America (CORSA) meet for their annual convention at Little America this week.

Themed "A Cool Vair Affair," the convention is an opportunity for Corvair enthusiasts from around the world to meet, compare notes, learn, boast and show off their own pieces of nostalgia.

The Corvair gained notoriety after its initial production because of numerous defects, and the publication of Ralph Nader's book "Unsafe at Any Speed" in 1965. The defects were corrected in the 1966 model, but the public image was tarnished enough that General Motors discontinued production in 1969.

Nonetheless, the car attracted a loyal following world-wide very early on; the Cactus Corvair Club was founded in 1962, only three years after it began. It remains one of the most beloved classic cars in existence.

According to convention merchandiser Melvin Brown, Corvair enthusiasts associate the car with their child-hood.

"These are the cars that we grew up with," he said. "They were 'The Thing' when we were growing up."

More than 1,000 people are in attendance, with ap-proximately 300 Corvairs of all years, varieties and colors present.


The cars have been driven from as far away as North Carolina and Chicago, said Brown of Phoenix. Some attendees have come even farther. The convention roster includes residents of Australia and France.

Many of the convention's activities are open to the public. Flagstaff residents are welcome to attend today's Autocross, an obstacle course race scheduled from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Northern Arizona University Skydome. The public also is welcome at the model car exhibition and judging, to be held from 10 a.m. to noon in the Coconino Room at Little America Hotel.

Saturday's Economy Run, a contest to travel a predesignated route with the best fuel economy, also may be of interest to locals. It will begin at the circle drive at Little America at 9 a.m.

Finally, a fully restored 1966 Corvair convertible will be raffled off. Tickets are available for \$2.50 each in the lobby of Little America between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. today and Saturday. The drawing will be Saturday evening at the final banquet of the convention. The winner will be notified by phone.
