

We drove the old Turquoise Trail on Highway 14 north towards Santa Fe. We proceeded through Madrid, which was heavily crowded with tourists enjoying this great former mining town. My father used to get coal from Madrid in the 1940's. My father, Hector Gongora, helped build a Seventh Day Adventist school in Corrales and he would drive the roads from Corrales to the north side of the Sandias to get coal from Madrid.

Continuing through Cerrillos, we were just short of the connection to I-25 when we came to Joel and Valerie's home. Tarmo Sutt had driven his 65 Corsa and we also met Richard Blake, a car enthusiast and Richard had opened his home for the second part of the tour.

Joel and Valerie prepared a feast for our club and there were plenty of desserts. We ate on their porch and enjoyed a panoramic view to the north. What a peaceful place!! After lunch, Richard excused himself to prepare our visit to his garage and the rest of us were taken to Joel's garages to see what he was working on. The Corvair convertible was in the queue for upcoming repairs. His four-car garage includes two lifts for working on his projects. Joel has a wide interest in all models. His collection includes a Dodge Polaris convertible which he drove in his younger days. He has a Buick Reatta, he says if you can remove it from his garage, you can have it. (You better check with Joel to see if he was kidding!! Ha Ha) It is tightly hidden in the back of the garage.

After touring Joel and Valerie's place we caravanned to Richard's fifteen-car garage. It is on highway 14 south of Joel's. Like Joel, Richard's interest in cars is wide. He had a great mix of models and years. When we drove to the property, we were all amazed as all the cars were backed out of the garages for us to enjoy. Richard is 88 years old and has worked in the scientific field in many places, including Los Alamos. He moved from Eldorado to his current location to have the freedom to build what he needed for his hobby. The separate garages were built to house different eras of cars. The main garages have a center bay with a heavy duty lift and two double bay garages on either side. Three other building house the remaining classics. Studebakers, Cadillacs. Chryslers, Oldsmobiles, Rolls Royce, Mercedes, BMW, Lexus were some of the cars we saw. The buildings, the floors, the posters, artwork, memorabilia, and tools were all neat and tidy. As they say, "you could eat off the floors". We all noticed masking tape on the floor. He uses them to park each car in the bay. He has a matching tape on the door sill. Not too far out or in. The cars are perfectly placed.

When I saw Richard at Joel's, I thought he looked familiar. It took only a few minutes to confirm I had indeed met him at the House of Covers with his classic 1963 Pontiac Grand Prix. I had to ask him of all the exotic cars he owned and all the driving he has done with them, which is his favorite. He had a long pause and you could see it was a tough question. He finally admitted the silver Pontiac Grand Prix is the one he tends to lean towards.

With all the tours the club has put together, you really want to put them on your calendar and make an effort to join in. The real treasure of course is the people you encounter and the people that make it happen. Richard, Joel, Valerie, Greg, Tarmo and Brenda made this an adventure to remember. 

Deer Story Sunday 21 September 2025

This morning as I was going to Albertson's for groceries, I saw something that would have made a charming video, had I had my camera at hand and set up for "video" instead of "photo" but since I did not, you will have to use your imagination to make your own video in your head, based on what I can remember and write down here.

It's a four-lane divided highway, Tramway Boulevard, and I'm headed north. Traffic is light. It's about 8:20 AM. The road is two lanes each way, with turn lanes at the traffic lights. I see a traffic light up ahead turn from green to red so I start slowing.

Before I get to the intersection I am startled to see three deer, one larger, two smaller, to my right, apparently about to cross the intersection. It is almost as if they were pedestrians, waiting for a green light to cross!

I quickly realize from their sizes that it's a mother deer and two fawns. They are not close together but are walking in single file. I notice that the mother deer appears to be oblivious of me and the other one or two nearby vehicles who have all stopped for the red light, and also oblivious of whether her babies are following her. She walks sedately across one, two, three lanes. At about the middle of the intersection she stops and half-turns as if she just remembered her children and turns to look back at them. They are still walking after her. She turns and, no hurry whatever, continues walking west.

The scene reminds me of the image of the mother duck waddling along, her brood following behind. Except that the mother deer is walking, not waddling, and there are two walking fawns, not a brood.

We drivers sit and watch this in awe until the deer disappear off the pavement to the west. The red light turns green. We continue on our way.

What the other drivers think, I have no idea. I have seen deer cross the road in the Sandias but I have never seen anything like this at a traffic light on a major 50-MPH highway. I am charmed and delighted and fortunate to have seen it happen.
