




## Corvanatics Corvair 95 Registry Certificates

## 20 years ago - Corvan - Antics Volume 33-4, July-August 2005



The cover of this edition paid homage to the old-fashion rituals of buying a new car, which involved visiting the different dealerships with flashy new model ad campaigns and collecting sales brochures adorned with hand-drawn artwork and choices of available options. Not so in today's mega dealerships, where available vehicles can be inspected online and options are on a "what's on the lot is what you get" basis.

## 10 years ago - Corvan - Antics Volume 43-3, May-June 2015

"Riding with President" introduced the new Corvanatics President, Chris Nickel, grandson of the previous president, John Nickel. Chris was elected president at that year's convention and, at age 18, is likely to remain the record holder for the youngest holder of the office. It was a one-term presidency.
