


## Reviving the Rampside - Continued

Continuing my Rampside revival story from [Vol 51, Issue 2, March-April 2023](#), page 6, things have progressed rather well, slowly, and sometimes painfully slow, but well. The new gas tank is in, brake system components have been replaced, and the motor is back in and running. Like any restoration work on a 60+ year old vehicle there have been some challenges, obstacles to overcome and prior “restoration” work to redo. That being said, it lives and on June 20th it moved under its own power again after almost 25 years in my driveway on jackstands. Is it pretty? No, not by a long shot. Is it weather tight? No, not yet but it runs and that was my main goal. I wanted it on the road again and it's there.

Since I first saw it, it's always been called the Rampside, nothing special, just the Rampside. However, in going through the various part numbers and such to try and bring things back to original I have decided to call it Freddie. Freddie, you may ask. Why Freddie? The VIN tag is 3R124F100417, which makes it a Flint truck, an early 1963 Flint truck. A scrappy survivor. Back in the mid-1970s I worked a summer in Flint at a DuPont paint plant. While there I bought a tee shirt that had an artistic rendering of Freddie, an industrial rodent, mascot of Flint, Michigan. I always thought it was a cool drawing and kept the shirt till it wore out. Before throwing it away I even had the drawing scanned. That drawing depicted Freddie as a Flint survivor. My Rampside is a Flint survivor, so Freddie it is.





## 2025 DACC Homecoming in Ann Arbor, MI this July.

Last month, five members from the Dayton club made a trip to Ann Arbor to attend the Detroit Area Corvair Club (DACC) annual Homecoming. Duane and Darcy brought their '66 blue Monza coupe, while Norbert Bir drove his '64 Spyder. It was tough to keep track of the total number of Corvairs since they kept coming and going. We counted at least ten FC's. There was just one Rampside, two Loadsides, and six Greenbriers, plus a Corvan. Unfortunately, Kevin and Susan couldn't drive their Corvan because of some fuel delivery issues.

The hotel's conference center is spacious, where the registration booth and valve cover race track were set up. An indoor pool and bar nearby provided some relief from the scorching summer heat. The hospitality room and indoor vendors room was just a short distance away, and just outside from the indoor vendors room is the outdoor swap meet.

You don't need to worry about packing food or drinks. The DACC crew will take care of that. They have a special room called Ken Pepke's World Class Hospitality Room where you can get lunch and dinner, plus drinks, every day. On Thursday, they grilled hamburgers, hot dogs, and brats, and on Friday, they served pizza. The host hotel also provides a free continental breakfast.

On Thursday, those who had pre-registered had lunch at the Ypsilanti Auto Heritage Museum. It's a cool museum that still has some vintage charm and was used as a dealership. It was the first Dodge dealership outside of Detroit around 1916. Later, Carl Miller sold Hudson cars there for 25 years, from Hudson Sales and Service until 1958. Carl was the last Hudson dealer in the world. Other tours included the Corvair Museum &

Firehouse Museum and a Cruise Night in Ypsilanti. On Friday, it was a road rally. Norbert invited DACC member Eva Karse, who volunteered to navigate, and Darcy and Duane to ride along. They didn't win, but they still had a great time seeing the scenery.

Larry Claypool from Chicagoland Corvair Enthusiasts gave a really informative presentation on different electric fuel pumps that are available. There are so many choices that you have to decide whether to switch from a mechanical to an electric fuel pump. Larry explained the pros and cons of each one.

Chris Hand showed his photo documentary slide show about his adventure with his dog, Radar. Chris drove his Corvan from Michigan to California to attend the 2025 Corvair Convention in San Luis Obispo. On his way to the convention, he had two breakdowns, and it took him 9 days and 2862.6 miles. Getting the Corvan there after the breakdown earned him the Hard Luck Award.

Also on Friday was a movie in the small auditorium. Mr. Holland's Opus with Richard Dreyfuss starring in the 1995 film. Everyone just had to see the Corvair as the star of this movie.

Saturday was packed with activities. One was the People's Choice car show. With so many Corvairs to choose from, you only needed to pick your favorites regardless of their class, and the top 25 winners were notified to get their pictures taken. Afterwards in the evening, the winners lined up for a Drive-Thru award presentation with Pete Cimbala as MC. With your paid registration, you'll receive their Top 25 Corvair calendar for next year.

The valve cover race had competitors in adult and kids classes. It proved to be a fun event for all ages.

Each valve cover race car was unique in its design and style. Sometimes it was fun to watch them crash over the finish line.

Other activities included the model cars and Corvair toy exhibition. They were always neat to see how well each display was presented in a small scale.

The DACC crew pulled in some serious cash by auctioning off donated items. They weren't always Corvair-related, though. If you had something you just couldn't bear to part with, it might've ended up in the hands of someone who really needed it.

And finally, the last thing on the list was the wine and cheese tasting event. It was just for hotel guests who had pre-registered at an extra fee.


## 50 years ago, Corvan - Antics, 3-3, Fall 1975

By Fall 1975, The finances of the club were becoming more promising. The numbers were being looked after by Cecil Miller, the new club Secretary-Treasurer, who reported that membership stood at 103 with the recent addition of 21 new members. Thus, surge in new members reflected an ongoing membership drive, “refer two new paying members [to] earn a free 1-year free Corvanatics membership and subscription to the newsletter” and the Corvanatics display at that year’s national convention in Seattle.

## 40 years ago - Corvan - Antics Volume 13-5, September-October 1985

Bob Kirkman described the one-of-a-kind FC folding rear seat. The seat was designed by Chevrolet Engineering and a prototype built for a '61 Greenbrier. As shown in the illustration, both the seat bottom and back would fold-forward.

Bob reported that the seat never went into production and although the prototype had been salvaged its whereabouts were unknown. We now know that the seat, shown in the picture to the right, still exists in 64 Greenbrier S103963,



## 30 years ago, Corvan - Antics, September-October 1995

## 20 years ago - Corvan - Antics Volume 33-5, September-October 2005

The club finances were again rather tight, a consequence of the rising cost of publishing the newsletter and some excessive generosity to the membership. The problem dated back to 2003 when the membership subscription rate was raised from \$6 to \$10 but allowing members to continue at the old price with a three-year subscription for \$18. It was a good deal and accepted by 125 members. However, the transient increase in revenue turned into a deficit in 2005 since the old rate \$6 was not enough to cover the publication costs. We have been shifting to a digital newsletter due to the ever-increasing costs of publishing in paper form . . . .

## 10 years ago - Corvan - Antics Volume 43-5, September-October 2015

. . . which again, 10 years later, necessitated an increase from \$10 to \$12 for the printed newsletter. The price for the e-version remained the same. In other news, FCs made a good showing at the Detroit Area Corvair Club (DACC) Homecoming and the Choo Choo Corvair Classic in Chattanooga. And finally, Scott Allison wrote about his legendary “double Loadside” – that’s right, an FC pickup lacking a ramp on both sides – and that’s all I’ll say about that!
