A Cautionary Tale

Rich needed to remove the gas tank from his red 1963 Spyder convertible for the first time in 33 years. He did so because he had determined that the fuel return hose connection at the top of the tank was dripping fuel. "33 years of ethanol turned it into mush," Rich reported.

At the same time, Rich decided to investigate why, for most of those of 33 years, the fuel gauge would stop moving a bit below the one-quarter mark. "If you wiggle the wheel and the needle no longer moves, you need to visit a fuel dispensary." This was a lesson learned from a one-mile walk he once took.

So he removed the fuel sender, and thought something did not look right. Sure enough, the float was installed facing in the wrong direction. It hit the side of the tank at about the one-quarter point. This caused him to remember a scratching sound at the front of the car sometimes, which he now realized was not suspension, not sway bar bushings. It was the float hitting the side of the tank.

So while the fuel float can be installed facing in either of two directions, only one of those directions is correct. But Rich didn't tell us how to tell the difference. We'll let this photo, found online, be our guide. Hey, if it is on the internet it has to be correct, right?
