So after the meetup, I headed out to the beach area of Bowers Beach, a small bay beach, to take a stroll out onto the jetty. On the top right you will find two photos.





I'll admit freely that I have obsessive-compulsive tendencies. It's part of why I have collected Corvair parts over the years. It's also part of why I have maintained a scrupulous list of those parts.



But following Sue's brain surgery and move to the 55+ community, I made the decision to "un-hoard" and start selling off my far too large collection of parts. In 2021, when we moved, that scrupulous list said that I had (gulp) 4,530 individual Corvair parts! It took countless trips with my truck and trailer to move it all.

My selling philosophy was "largest and heaviest first". Things like engines, transaxles, body panels, seats and glass were the first to go. Little by little I worked my way down to the smaller items. I also sold at the annual Detroit Corvair "Homecoming" and via the various online venues such as Corvair Trader on Facebook. I also sold two pickup loads to Clark's Corvair Parts and took two additional loads to the Corvair Ranch. I approached selling only as an OCD person can: It became my mission.

Most recently, I sold at the Corsa Convention that took place in Dayton, Ohio. As a marketing gimmick and to break the ice with people visiting my tables, I had a sign shown in the accompanying photo. It worked. The sign itself drew laughs and was photographed numerous times. A significant number of women looked at it and said, "My

husband needs to do that!" Sales at the convention were good.



Upon my return from the convention, as per usual, I again updated my scrupulous list of parts. Where once I had thousands of parts, I now have a mere 93 individual parts! From 4, 530 to 93! I am going to keep selling until even those 93 parts are gone. But after the convention, an interesting thought was expressed to me by a friend: I no longer qualify as a hoarder. It is a remarkably satisfying feeling.
