

My Corvair History

Corvair Odyssey

The opportunity was there in 1960 to look at the new realm of compact car offerings. The new rear-engine Corvair compact was technically interesting, but the lure of a Tri-power Impala drop-top prevailed for this High School Junior. Not until 1964 did life and wife become a two car family. A popular Pennsylvania car lot offered a '63 Monza Spyder. Sold!

Starting it the next morning was an event, or rather a non-event. It wouldn't start! The choke cover was gone. Moral – look at the engine before driving it away from the dealer's lot! What next? Popular mods were put on the Spyder. Michelin X tires, camber compensator bar, wrap the exhaust to add another three psi boost. Really nothing extensive, but the handling improved and the boost kick at 3400 RPM was thrilling.

Onward to the '61 Lakewood - but that's another chapter.

The black '62 Monza had had a fire intentionally set by some locals – not much damage. It went on to be a reliable commuter car after some repairs and paint.

Little brother's garage band needed a van so my newly acquired '63 Corvair van served that purpose.

A '60 coupe was intended to be a drag car or small block Chevy conversion to copy the first conversion of this type by friend, Bob Sotto in Elizabeth, NJ but ultimately too much rust plus the work and \$ needed ended that project. (Family needs and the new house may have been a factor.)

The mid 1960s found few shops who were able or willing to do Corvair work. I would do a de-leaking job or a clutch replacement almost every weekend for good money.

Enter the second generation.

A '66 Corsa 140 gold coupe became a passion in spite of the bullet holes in the door. It was such a thrill to drive that the lure of a cousin's '65 convertible, affectionately known in the family as Old Redd-y can't be denied. He's doing the installation of a '66 drive train into a '63 model 95 van, plus a '48 Jaguar restoration. There's no time or garage space for the Corvair restoration.

That convertible got my 176 cid four carb engine with all of the Bill Thomas, Grumpy Jenkins, Bill Fisher, etc. mods and some of my own experiments from building performance engines. Was it strong? You bet! But a two-year storage in a damp garage while I was overseas left the bodywork mostly rust. After all, it was a New Hampshire car. That engine went to the West Coast, I cried.

Three decades later my restored 1912 Overland was sold and the '29 Studebaker restoration nearly finished, Rod and Custom magazine ran a Corvair powered T-bucket illustration. Very interesting?!! Along came a '66 twin to old Redd-y and it would yield its total drive train and a slew of parts to a totally custom twin Corvair engine, yes, a 'Flat 12' hot rod. As this is being written, the project is five years in the making but what better thing to do in retirement?

Tim seconded it. A vote was made by the club to cover the cost to purchase the invites and mail them out as soon as possible. Tim said he will send Jean a roster today.

Brian asked anyone who is interested in participating in the Corvair Mileage contest to please send in their miles.

The meeting ended around 10 AM.

Annual NJACE Indoor Corvair Parts Auction

Saturday, March 1st, 2025

Pompton Lakes Elks Lodge

15 Perrin Avenue

Pompton Lakes NJ.

Time: 9 AM for setup, bidding begins 10:30 AM.

Ends approximately 3 PM.

Admission: No charge. All Corvair enthusiasts are welcome.

Staged by our member-auctioneers, this indoor wintertime event provides ample opportunity to get hot deals on Corvair parts and is consistently one of our most popular activities.

At the auction our member-auctioneers offer Corvair parts and Corvair-related items to the highest bidder, with a 10% commission of the sale price going to the club treasury. You may bring parts to sell, you may buy, you may do both, or you may just come to enjoy the fun.

There is always ample entertainment with jokes ranging from bang-zoom to awful groaners as the auctioneers hawk the many parts being offered for sale. Breakfast and lunch are available on-site by the members of the Elks Lodge.

As is the case every year, it's impossible to predict the kinds of parts that will be offered, but there is always a good selection and many of them go for prices that are way, way below those being charged by the big Corvair vendors.

This year we have a special consignment of many, many NOS parts from the collection of longtime club supporter Jack Rogers. As a result, we will have limited space for additional *consignments*. We ask sellers to be selective in what they bring. Clean parts in good condition, parts that are less common, and new-old-stock *parts*



are best. Greasy, broken junk has little or no value. Leave the dirty, bent, rusty stuff at home. Corvair and Corvair-related items, only, please. No general automotive items.

We encourage the selling of parts in "lots." For example, sell an instrument cluster and a glove box door together, not as separate items. And we discourage the selling of too many of the same thing. For example, if you have six pairs of cylinder heads to sell, consider offering only one pair at the auction.

How does the auction work? All Corvair enthusiasts are welcome and invited! All you need to bring is parts and/or cash. Doors open at 9:00 AM for set-up, we begin the bidding at 10:30 AM, take a lunch break at 12:30 PM, resume the bidding at 1:00 PM, and finish up typically around 2:30 PM. Only at that time can we tally the sales, collect from the buyers, and pay the sellers.

Due to the nature of how the auction operates, it is not possible to process any buyers or sellers until the auction is completed. For this reason we ask that you plan on making a day of it. We cannot accommodate those who may wish to settle up before the auction is completed.

If you're selling, you can set a minimum acceptable bid for your parts, or no minimum bid at all! NJACE will collect a 10% commission on the sale of parts. You may also donate items for the full benefit of the club. As a seller you should organize

your parts at home, so that you can quickly fill out the Lot Cards that will be used at the auction.

You can download and print the Lot Cards from the NJACE web site:

https://www.corvair.org/chapters/njace/Auction_Lot_Cards.pdf, and they will be available on-site as well. A Lot Card is needed for each part or group of parts being sold as one, so please allow sufficient time to do this before the start of bidding.

On the morning of the auction there will be time to set up your parts and tag them if you have not yet done so. By organizing in advance at home, setup will be easier. If you don't want to be bothered tagging your parts and you just want to donate them to the club, bring 'em and we'll handle everything for you. (Parts donations have typically been one of our club's largest fund-raisers each year.)

If you're buying, you will be given a Bidder Number which will be used to record your purchase whenever you're the successful bidder. You'll receive your purchases on the spot, but you'll need to pay for them (by cash or check, cash preferred) before leaving. For this reason we ask that you be prepared to stay for the full auction, so that the bookkeepers can record all the sales and tally the results without interruption.

Join in the fun! The NJACE Small Parts Auction is always a lot of fun because it gives us a chance to catch up with Corvair people from across New Jersey and the region. If you don't have any parts to sell come anyway -- there are always great bargains to be had and there are always plenty of laughs. The auction is a great way to see a lot of unusual parts and enjoy the competitive bidding. If you're looking for something in particular chances are good that you'll find it there. The best part about the auction is, a chance to get together with a great bunch of people.-
