A new Swiss device is being developed to replace the carburetor in internal combustion engines. That device, made of a sleeve in full ventilation of from 8% to 15% depending on the vehicle, a reduction in carbon monoxide formation of between 30% and 50%, better starting in cold weather and an increase in top speed of up to 10 miles an hour, has been developed by Autel's mechaniques Broyer SA. The device, called AutoFach, is a combustion spraying plug that substitutes a flame for the conventional electrical spark. This flame is produced in a pre-combustion chamber situated in the body of the plug. By an ionizing revolving spark wheel, sets on the compressed air-gasoline mixture in each cylinder in operation, therefore, the plug is somewhat similar to the controlled vortex combustion chamber (CVCC) and similar techniques used with some success by Japanese automakers to increase the fuel efficiency of their cars, except that the AutoFach can be inserted into regular cylinder head configurations. According to the company's test data, the converter has a very long life--typically 20,000 to 30,000 miles. 
