

The new member section included a fellow from Jeannette named Ken Good, and new member leader Kroos, represented WPCO in a show and parade in Titusville, Pa. Finally, some guy named Wayne Jones wanted a right side exhaust manifold for a 65. 140 H.P.

TECH TIP FROM CORSA TRUST BY TED BAERT

One of the hardest parts in Corvair engine work is cleaning of the sheet metal gird pieces. Some of the choices we have are: sand blasting (expensive), hot tank at the local machine shop (also expensive), good old scrape and wire brush (time consuming and not all that effective) and a method I have been using.

Before I tell you how I must warn you that the chemicals I use will take your skin down to the primer and could cause eye damage. Wear Rubber Gloves and eye protection!

The parts are first put into a plastic trash can or an old stainless steel sink. Add 1/2 (approximately) 1 can to 15 gallons of water. Then fill with water being careful not to splash. Leave parts in solution for about a week. Before removing parts, have available a hose with nozzle and some S.O.S. Pads. Remove one piece at a time and rinse with high pressure. Any remaining paint should be easily removed with an S.O.S. Pad.

You can find lye with the drain cleaners at the grocery. Put wires on paste for removal from solution. Remove all screws, clamps and brackets. Rubber parts are not damaged in solution. Keep parts protected from weather until painted. Soak parts as they come from the car, so need to decrease.

Remember keep away from kids, read the label.

Next month we'll talk about refinishing your clean parts.

TRUCKS

1950 FORD by Joe & Louise, WVA

If you have a trucked-out Corvair which has been parked a long time, don't count the motor as well. The exhaust system has been dismantled and is spaced. You must install the manifold and engine pipe. Blowing that out through the turbo will ruin an injector. Have the pistons & the injector looked at.

RITZ-ICE CREAM DESSERT - Jane Rockfall

Set out a 2 gallon inc cream to thaw -(butter pecan, vanilla, choc, etc.)
Crush 80 Ritz crackers
Add 2 sticks melted choc to crackers and mix.
Put crackers into 9x12 pan.
Make 2 small packages instant pudding using 1 1/2 to 2 cups milk (any flavor pudding)
Add pudding to ice cream and blend well. Pour over Ritz mixture. Freeze. Let stand 1/2 hr, before serving.
Some Ritz mixture can be set aside to sprinkle over ice cream mixture before freezing. I like to use vanilla ice cream and butter pecan pudding.

STAINED GLASS COOKIES - Shirley Krouse

1 pkz. (12 oz.) choc. chips
1 stick choc - Melt these together.
Add:
1 c. Chopped nuts
1 bag miniature marshmallows - colored
Mix all together. Divide into 4 Rolls.
Roll onto sheets of waxed paper covered with racoonut. Wrap rolls in foil. Refrigerate over-night.
Cut into slices. Keeps well.

PEANUT BUTTER CUP COOKIES - Lameyre Holdersheim
80 Peanut Butter Cups*

Cream together: 1 c. oleo, 1 c. sugar, 1 c. brown sugar. Add 2 eggs.
Add: 3 c. flour, 1/2 tsp. baking soda, 1 tsp. salt.
When well mixed add 1 tsp. vanilla. Roll into balls a little smaller than a ping pong ball. Bake in 2 inch paper cups (in muffin pans if desired) at 375 8-10 min.
Put peanut butter cup on top as soon as they come out of oven and gently push on hot cookies. Let cool well.
Makes 80 cookies - Freeze well.
