#### TECH. TIPS

Bates Murphy reports, that if you are considering switching to 14" wheels, Chevy wagons use a wider wheel than the Chevy pessenger cars, these should be perfect for your Vair.

The tip to the right by Larry Claypool of the Chicagoland Corvair Club is the best solution I've heard yet to combat the leaded premium gascline problem.

A few other thoughts as the octane gets lower: Less heat - less pinging, so gunk the underside of your ergins & clean the upper shrouding. All that oily crud holds in the heat. Also switch to a turbo or 140 oil cooler. How about smaller tires such as Michelin's 15", it's just like a gear ratio change.

TECH TIPS by Larry Claypool

A tip or so ago I told about gas requirements for the Vair One item I everlooked was how to mix current grades of gas to achieve a satisfactory octane level. It seems that the now popular premium no-lead gas mixes quite favorably with the lead in regular leaded. According to Sheli, a mixture of 80% no-lead premium (92 octane) and 20% regular leaded (39 octane) will give a result of 94 octane, or just about what Shell leaded premium used to be By the same token, the same proportions using leaded premium rather than leaded regular should give an optimistic figure of around 96.

Admittedly, the no-lead premium ain't cheap (about 95% a gallon as of this writing) but it is getting pretty easy to get these days compared to leaded premium, particularly along interstates and expressways

I've had very gratifying results putting in about \$3 of leaded premium from any of the discount stations that still carry it, then topping off the tank with premium unleaded from Amoco or Shell. The former 3rd & th gear ping from the turbo has all but disappeared so despite the higher cost, I'm pleased as hell about how it runs.

# TWO MORE SUPER TIPS FROM THE CHICAGO CORVAIR FOLKS:

A SHORY TECH TIP --

When the time finally comes when you've had it with jumper cables and push starts, you'll dig deep into your pocket and cough up the bucks for a new battery. If you go by the application charts you'll see the trucks and early Corveirs use a size 53 battery, while late models use a 22F. Never, of course, use that info, for you'll be getting less for the same price. A size 27F or 24F battery of the same guarantee costs no more than a size 22F, yet the chart live made, using Sears batteries, tells the story. Since space is no restriction, buy the huge 27F and forget about cold or extreme hot starting troubles.

Early Corvairs and trucks ARE very limited in space restrictions, so here, a size 29NF battery does the job-Just a shade bigger in all dimensions, it still fits the battery box, but really delivers the power. (NOTE: I don't endorse Sears batteries, chart is for comparison ONLY.)

# LOWER COMPRESSION RATIO TIP by Charley Biddle

Can you remember a time that when gasoline was rated at 96, the reference was to the octane, and not the price? As the octane rating of available gasoline goes down, the rate of pinging in our Lorvairs goes up.

The way to utilize lower octane gasoline is to lower the compression ratio of the engine. The easiest way to do this on a Corvair is to add cylinder barrel gaskets between the cylinders and the aluminum block. These

should not be confused with the head gaskets which go between the barrel tops and the cylinder heads.

These gaskets, made out of stamped steel, are 614 inches thick each, and will lower the compression ratio of a cylinder by about -22 of a compression ratio On a stock hore '64 or later course, one of these qualities will add -1299 cobic inches to the computation chardes.

The following is a chart showing how a typical '64 ill he engine's compression ratio changes when one or two extra cylinder barrel gaskets are added (lotal of two or three, respectively) to lower chaptession. Compression figures shown were mathematically calculated using data available in 'How to Hotized Your Corvait' by Bill Fisher. Data shown is for a normal lew cubic inchengine, and a + 060 overbore ipossible by using a kit from DTTO Party) to get 167 5 cubic inches the '64 ill he engine is advertised at a 9.2 compression ratio, although the actual ratio is somewhat lower.
