

Tech. Tip from Bill Artsberger:

If you find that a sheet metal screw will not hold, rather than going to a larger screw, place a short length of copper or aluminum wire in the epening and try the original screw again. If it still won't bite, try a larger guage wire. If you bend the wire alightly, it will lay in place, then stip every any visable excess with a pair of cutting pliers.
