



# Cream Puff - Corvair 1965

My friend sold me the subject, "cream-puff". I paid \$400.00 for the car in April 1976 and finally got delivery in November 1976. I didn't mind that, but the car started leaking on me, even news papers on my lap didn't help. The leak would avoid the papers and hit me on the head! I avoided the leak by wearing a rain coat at all times. Then the car started to make funny noises, when the mechanic took the front wheel off to check on the noise, I also discovered it had no brakes! The brakes and front wheel axle were replaced and I was pleased. Then we had a very heavy rain storm and I was wet again! The car stalled on the L.I. Expressway during the rain storm. I thought it stalled because of the amount of water it was carrying! Fortunately, I was towed five miles to a station. I checked into a motel soaking wet.
