

TECH TIPS

A shot in the ARM

To repair back-up light switch on transmission for early to 65 4 speed, get a 5 pin connector from Radio Shack. Disassemble the switch and replace the composition piece that holds the wires with the 5 pin connector after sawing the pins off. Cut off the middle wire. Connect the two from the one side to the black wire in the harness and the other two to the white wire. Tie the connector in place with 18 ga. steel wire. Seal the whole thing with silicon sealer. Set aside until dry, then replace in the car.


