




FIVE YEARS AGO

THE JUNE 1982 JOURNAL COVER WAS A LARGE PICTURE OF OUR OWN JOHN SWEET AND THE BOLD PRINT PROCLAIMED THAT "WPCC ENDORSES JOHN SWEET FOR CORSA BOARD OF DIRECTORS." INSIDE THE JOURNAL WAS JOHN'S CORVAIR RELATED AUTO-BIOGRAPHY AND A PEP TALK TO GET OUT AND VOTE BY EDITOR CHUCK LUCAS.

JIM LANE CAME THROUGH AGAIN BY ARRANGING FOR WPCC'S APPEARANCE IN THE GATEWAY CLIPPER FLEET'S "ANCHORS AWEIGH PARADE" TO CELEBRATE THE FLEETS MOVE TO THEIR NEW DOCKS AT STATION SQUARE. THE CLUB WAS ALSO BUSILY WORKING ON AN ENGINE REBUILD SO WE COULD RAFFLE IT OFF AT THE UPCOMING SYRACUSE NATIONAL CONVENTION.

TECH TIPS

I RECENTLY HAD THE EXPERIENCE OF DRIVING A CAR (NON-CORVAIR) WHICH HAD A MIX OF DIFFERENT WHEEL AND TIRE SIZES. THE HANDLING CHARACTERISTICS WERE UNIQUE TO SAY THE LEAST AND DOWNRIGHT DANGEROUS TO THE UNPREPARED. AT FIRST GLANCE EVERYTHING WHEEL AND TIREWISE APPEARED NORMAL, BUT ON CLOSER EXAMINATION IT WAS FOUND THAT THE FOUR WHEELS WERE MISMATCHED NAMELY ONE 14" WHEEL AND TIRE AND THREE 13" WHEELS AND TIRES. THE 13" WHEELS HAVING DIFFERENT OFFSETS.

I WOULD NOT EXPECT ANY CORVAIR OWNER TO BE DRIVING WITH ONE 14" AND THREE 13" RIMS, BUT GM USED THE 13" 5 HOLE WHEEL ON A VARIETY OF MODELS AND ALTHOUGH THE WHEELS APPEAR IDENTICAL, THERE ARE DIFFERENT RIM WIDTHS AND OFFSETS TO CONTEND WITH, AND A MISMATCH IS POSSIBLE IF SOMEONE SIMPLY WENT TO THE SALVAGE YARD AND ASKED FOR A 13" 5 LUG GM RIM OR WHEEL.

THE FOLLOWING DIMENSIONS APPLY TO A STOCK GM 13" 5 LUG WHEEL AS SUPPLIED AS ORIGINAL EQUIPMENT ON 1965-69 CORVAIRS. THERE ARE SEVERAL AFTERMARKET SUPPLIERS OF WHEELS WHICH HAVE IDENTICAL DIMENSIONS TO THE STOCK GM UNIT AND I WILL INCLUDE THE PART NUMBERS AT THE END OF THIS ARTICLE.

CAUTIONAL EXAMINATION OF WHEEL MATERIALS

NEEDED: FLAT PIECE OF PLYWOOD OR MASONRY IS BEST. NEXT BEST WOULD BE A FLAT SMOOTH CONCRETE SURFACE; ALSO A SHORT TAPE MEASURE WILL BE REQUIRED.

PROCEDURE: LAY THE WHEEL WITH TIRE REMOVED, OUT SIDE OR LUGNUT SIDE OF WHEEL DOWN ON SURFACE, EXAMINE THE OUTER EDGE TO MAKE SURE THAT IT IS TOUCHING THE SURFACE ALL THE WAY AROUND. ANY GAP WILL INDICATE A BENT OR DENTED WHEEL. TURN THE WHEEL OVER WITH THE LUGNUT SIDE FACING UP AND REPEAT THE EXAM.

THE NEXT STEP TO PERFORM IS THE DIMENSIONAL MEASUREMENTS USING A TAPE MEASURE. TAKE A MEASUREMENT ACROSS THE WHEEL TO DETERMINE THE DIAMETER; IT SHOULD BE EXACTLY 14 1/4" FOR A 13" GM WHEEL. NEXT MEASURE THE WIDTH OF THE RIM FROM THE FLAT SURFACE TO THE UPPER EDGE OF THE RIM; IT SHOULD BE 6 1/2". THE LAST MEASUREMENT IS THE OFFSET DIMENSION. USING THE TAPE MEASURE, STICK THE TAPE DOWN THROUGH A LUG HOLE UNTIL IT HITS THE FLAT SURFACE THE RIM IS RESTING ON; THE MEASUREMENT FROM THE FLAT SURFACE TO THE TOP OF THE LUG HOLE WILL BE 4 11/16". THE MEASUREMENTS FOR ALL FOUR WHEELS SHOULD COME OUT IDENTICAL AND THIS WILL INSURE A MATCHED SET OF RIMS.



