

CARBURETOR VACUUM LEAK TIP NO. 04-03-88

The radial venturi cluster in the carburetor can be a source of a vacuum leak.

Over the years of heating and cooling from normal operation its bottom can warp and not fit tight on its mounting surface. A repair solution is to remove the two brass tubes and flatten the base. Place a piece of fine sandpaper (I suggest 400 wet or dry, wet with gasoline or WD-40) on a flat smooth surface, rub the base of the cluster back and forth until it is flat. Re-Install with a new gasket and a possible leak is avoided. Also check the tubes for obstructions. The small one is in the idle circuit, and its opening should be 0.024 to 0.025. Any larger and you may have difficulty with the idle mixture adjustment.




