Sunday dawned bright and beautiful to compliment the 86 magnificent cars at Station Square preparing for the caravan to the park. Originally planned as one long parade of cars, the vehicles wound up travelling in several small groups to the park entrance from where all were regally led in by the Pitt percussion group.

Flagstaff Hill was transformed into a mix of cars unseen before in this city, beauty and elegance to behold--something for all tastes to enjoy and fantasize over. The Artzbergers, Baldingers, and Smiths with later help from Gene Rapp did all possible to extol the virtues of the Corvair. By the end of the day we even had the cars in VIP tents during the balloon launch which stirred even more interest and questions.

The six o'clock balloon launch cannot be described. Twenty balloons together hitting a crystal blue sky in a patchwork of color and moving downwind after the "HARE" was simply gorgeous. What a day, what an opportunity! Where were you??


