FEB.92

The third common leak is around the front trim and trunk lock assembly mounting studs. There are five of these studs, with the nuts located inside the trunk. Remove these nuts (one at a time), add silicone rubber or body caulking to the base of the stud, and retighten the nut.

Two final recommendations. Drill a 1/4" hole in the lowest part of the trunk floor to allow any accumulated water to drain out. Also, remove the "protective" rubber mat from the trunk floor. That mat traps and holds water on the trunk floor and will cause the floor to rot out fast.

STOP CARRYING WATER IN YOUR TRUNK


fix those leaks in problem areas.

You say you've got water in your trunk after an April shower or a car wash? Well, it's not supposed to be there. Water enters the late model trunks primarily from three common places, all of which are easily resealable, assuming you have no obvious holes in the trunk cavity.

Corvairs have a tendency to develop such holes, usually at the wheelhouse seams and trunk bottoms. The bottom rusts from the inside out because of rain leaks. Wheelhouse holes are caused by water and salt eating out the metal seams, made worse by poorly adhering undercoating in the wheel cavity. Repair any obvious holes first, before going after the common leaks.

One common leak allows water to enter from the trunk rain gutter, up near the trunk lid hinges. This is due to cracks (small ones at that), which develop with age in the dum-dum sealer used to smooth over metal seams not normally visible. To be specific, these cracks usually develop at seams in the bottom of the rain gutter, starting near the edge of the louvered vent sheet metal panel, and continuing on across the gutter about four inches. They are closer to the fender than the weather stripping. Reseal them with clear silicone rubber.

A second common leak is around the headlight buckets. The cure for these is to remove the headlight bezel (3 Phillips screws), the headlight pod (3 Phillips screws) and reseal the edges of the bucket with silicone rubber. Then reinstall the removed pieces.



FILLER PIPE FUMES

If you're using a stock oil filler cap, it's probably leaking oil fumes and keeping your engine compartment messy. Try cutting the toe off an old white sock and putting it over your oil filler pipe and cap, held in place by a rubber band (a Kleenex and rubber band cover also works). If the cap is leaking fumes, the white cover will begin to turn brown within a few minutes. One of mine did immediately, the other took nearly 100 miles of driving. But they both became saturated with oil.

I replaced the paper disc in the cap with a circle cut from 1/16-inch "cork/rubber" gasket material; now my white stocking stays white and my engine stays clean.




