
ACCESSORY INSTALLATION TIP

Buying accessories becomes always worse to avoid the problem of where to hook into the wiring on the various signal connections and fuse blocks have just about eliminated the terminal wires and nuts as a good method is to attach directly to the fuse block.

Cut a strip of .003-inch braze shield stock 1 inch by 1/4 inch. About 1/8-inch from one end, punch a hole in the center of the strip. Strip about 1/8 inch of insulation off the end of the accessory feed wire. Bend a right angle about halfway on the stripped conductor and push through the hole in the thin strip, and crimp end under the wire to the best grip.

Using a test light, select the circuit you wish to use at the fuse block. The circuit selected will depend on whether you want the accessory to operate only when the ignition is on, when the lights are on, or at all times. If the accessory has its own fuse, cut off the un-needed side of the fuse. If it does not, solder through the existing fuse.

Snap the fuse from the circuit, wrap the thin strip around the metal end of the fuse as shown in the illustration, and snap the fuse back into place. The strip is now designed to do the job, and stay in function with the fuse.
