THE NATIONAL CONVENTION

Carole & I were fortunate enough to fly out to San Diego and make the convention part of our vacation. It was a wonderful convention, in a wonderful town, and put on by a tremendous group of people. We took six reels of movies, and Wayne suggested that we show them as part of our August meeting.

After all of the hell raising that several of us chapters did last winter, the board must have known that the members wanted CORSA to get it's house in order. I really think that the board took some very bold steps in the right direction, and hopefully CORSA is now on a path to recovery. I will go into much more detail at the meeting, but for those who won't be able to make it, here is a very brief summary:

1. The officers remain the same for 1979.
2. A new insurance company with one million dollar coverage for events. We must pay a special event premium of \$75 for speed events, & \$35 for non-speed events.

3. As of Sept. CORSA will be managed by a professional Association Management company headed by Hal Marcus, who spoke at the business meeting, & banquet. I met & spoke with him extensively during the autocross. I came away with a very favorable impression. I feel that CORSA now has the potential to become a great club (What our little car deserves). BUT IT IS EVIDENT, THAT CORSA'S MEMBERSHIP CANNOT STAY AT OUR PRESENT 6100. IT MUST GROW TO THE 8500 LEVEL IN THE NEXT YEAR OR TWO OR WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO CONTINUE PROFESSIONAL MANAGEMENT. OUR CHARTER STATES THAT ALL LOCAL MEMBERS MUST ALSO BELONG TO THE NATIONAL ORGANIZATION. NO ONE HAS SCREAMED LOUDER FOR IMPROVEMENT THAN YOUNG TRULY (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF CORSA DIRECTOR, BILL KLOTH). THE BOARD HAS ACTED DILIGENTLY TO INITIATE THESE IMPROVEMENTS. IF YOU WANT TO SEE A STRONG NATIONAL CORVAIR CLUB IN FUTURE YEARS, YOU HAD BETTER JOIN IT NOW, TO INSURE ITS VERY SURVIVAL. APPLICATION FORMS ARE AVAILABLE THROUGH BOB SMITH, OUR TREASURER. 4. As of Sept. there will be only one publication: A monthly magazine with articles & ads still coming through our present editor.
5. CORSA will now maintain an event calendar, to minimize conflicts.
6. Board members will get travel expenses to the national & to a mid-winter meeting. It seems to be the only way to get them all together.
7. A new constitution will be published soon.
8. Scotty Smathers will head the Chapter Plan Committee.
9. Next years convention will probably be held in Detroit to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the Corvair changing from a production car to a collector's car.
HEY, THAT'S RIGHT IN OUR BACK YARD AGAIN, GET THAT VAIR IN SHAPE!!!

The speaker was none other than Bill Mitchell himself, who created the beautiful and classic style of the Corvair. He mentioned that six weeks after the 60 Vair was introduced, Europe had ten copies at the Paris Auto Show. This was the first American design ever copied by the smoky European designers, & THEY'RE STILL COPYING IT!!! A tremendous slide presentation of clay models etc. kept us on the edge of our seats. He ended his speech in tears as he related to us that to have lost both Ed Cole & the Corvair is a great personal tragedy to him. "I WILL BE FOREVER GRATEFUL TO YOU PEOPLE FOR KEEPING THE CORVAIR ALIVE", were his closing remarks.

Congratulations to Ivan for a tremendous streetcar run in the top ten raffle ticket contest. If you are disappointed in the sales performance of W. Loeschberg, please consider that if Ivan included his 308 sales in the W. Loeschberg total, the totals would be \$976 closer together. This is a significant number.

Tire sizes can be confusing. They are generally expressed in one of three systems. The metric system tells you the width of the fattest part of the inflated casing, excluding胎肩 (tire shoulder), and rim size. The old traditional "inch" system does the same. The third system relates the aspect ratio of the tire shaft to the width relative to the height (rim above surface).

In metric sizes, the larger number gives the tire width in millimeters. An "R" is used to designate "Radial" tire construction and the smaller number gives the rim size. In "inch" sizes, the same applies except the unit of measurement is inches to the nearest 1/100th. For example, a common Coker tire size would be the 7.00 x 15. This is 7.00" wide and a 15" rim would equate to a 7.00 x 15" in metric (175mm x 175)

The stated aspect ratio can be easily understood in the form of percentage. In a 70 series tire, the "70" means the height is 70% of the width. Radial tires are the 70, 60, and 50 series tires. 70's are 70%, 60's are 60%, and 70's are exactly twice as wide as wide as they are high.

An approximate interchangeability chart is below. The only difference in designation for Radials is the "R" in the designation.



AIR FILTER TEST

If there is any question of efficiency or performance, do check the filter periodically. A quick way to check the cleanliness of an filter is to pass a bright light into the air

flow and observe if light penetrates the filter element. If there is no light penetration, the filter element should be replaced.
