B. Body Shop Series Part V

The fifth in a tremendously informative series of bodywork articles by our own Bill Schmiedlin. Bill requests that NO ONE reproduce these articles without his permission. (3119 Bratbury Dr. Aliquippa, pa. 15001).

I cannot tell a lie - to save typing I clipped Bill's article from the C & T Sports Car Club's fine newsletter. Thanks for the typing, Caris, and feel free to clip & reproduce anything from our newsletter.

BODY SHOP SERIES PART V

From this point on, we will be working with a hypothetical car which we will assume has all the types of damage normally encountered. The car has rusted out areas, and many small dents.

SHAKE THE CAR - Remove all chrome, lights, etc. which are directly attached to the panel surfaces or will interfere with any areas to be repaired. This will make the car easier to work on, expose damage you wouldn't have seen otherwise, and protect these parts from damage from sand blasting, grinding, etc. I usually label parts and wires that are easily confused, and tape attaching hardware to the part - this will save much time when the car is reassembled.

WASH THE CAR - Thoroughly wash the car with cleaning solvent to remove all wax, silicone, oil and oil. ~~This~~ this step is not absolutely necessary if the car is to be paint stripped.

MARK & ANALYZE DAMAGE - By sifting down all panels, feeling with hands, etc. locate and circle with a paint stick or magic marker, all dents, rust pits, etc. Take your time here as small pits and other damage are easily missed - especially on a dull, weathered surface. Analyze the damage as it is located and decide how each area is to be repaired (it - patch, plastic, glazing putty, etc.). It is often helpful to put an abbreviated indication on metal panels as to the repair medium to be used - this way you don't have to second guess.

HAND BLAST - Lower the engine and tape off areas where you don't want sand to enter. Any glass or chrome adjacent to areas to be sand blasted must be thoroughly masked. Use heavy card board or cut up an old inner tube and tape pieces on areas to be protected. Wear a respirator, leather gloves, long sleeves (bracelets or tight), and face protection while sand blasting. An arc welding hood with clear glass visor would help for face/eye protection. Care must be taken when blasting flat surfaces as the sand will actually expand the outer surface of the metal creating a high spot - blast areas only long enough to remove all traces of rust. If you're using a blaster that operates continuously, care must be taken while moving from one area to the next. Do don't want to blast areas in between, so turn handle to the ground or shield it with clapping hand or piece of sheet metal. When finished blasting blow off dust and/or vacuum to remove all traces of sand.

PATCHING - Take paper patterns of all rusted out areas that must be patched with sheet metal. Use these patterns to make three metal duplicates, which are then bent or formed to fit their respective areas. When you are satisfied that a patch fits properly, scribe a line around the edge of the patch. Now, with your panel cutter, remove the rusted metal leaving $\frac{1}{8}$ " of metal which is overlapped the patch - this will ease peeling or breaking. Clamp or hold the patch in place and take welds along the top to patch is tight against the metal being repaired. When you have a lock weld every 1"-2", complete the job with a sonic weld.

Exercise due to the heavy nature of plasticastic aluminum - especially in large flat areas. This can be minimized by packing aluminum tape (or wire mesh) along both sides of the seam to be welded. Another good practice is to lay a "V" bead, cap 2", lay a "J" bead, etc. until you end up with a sonic weld - this helps heat build-up to a minimum thereby reducing warpage.

Grind all welds and hammer & file where necessary to remove nicks and high spots. Stubborn high spots may be removed by a process called "shanking". This is done by heating (red hot) a small area about the size of a half dollar. This spot is then immediately hammered to bring the high spot level. Alternately heating and hammering will bring even large high spots to proper level.

Remember that all surfaces to be filled must be lower than their surrounding areas if a flat surface is to be attained. It may be necessary to hammer down or counter sink damaged areas slightly. A straight edge can be used as a final check for high spots and for determining how thick the filler will be. Remember, we want to hold filler thickness to $\frac{1}{8}$ " or less.

In my introduction several months ago I stated that I would show you a method for getting metal perfectly flat. Now we're all aware how thin I done it - we start with the plastic filler stage and proceed from there.
