1. OUR NEXT MEETING TUESDAY FEB. 28 8 PM SECOND FEDERAL IN MURRYSVILLE



In our opinion - new general elections are Corva's last chance to fully regain the confidence of its dwindling membership.

- 63 - 73 Corvette - Front
- 55 - 57 Chevy - Front
- 69 - 70 Olds (Except Toronado)
- 57 - 64 Ford - Front
- 58 - 60 Edsel - Front (How about that?)
- 57 - 59 Ranchero - Front
- 59 - 60 Thunderbird - Front

V-8 and Corvette

Although not actually a letter writer, I was stirred to action by a couple of "Crap shots" contained in a letter from Jim MacLaren in the December 13 issue. While others may wish to comment on his theories concerning the decline of the Studebaker mark, I take personal umbrage with his statement that one reason was the replacement of the "high quality" Studebaker engine with the "mediocre Chevrolet 302 V8." Certainly anyone with even a smattering of automotive knowledge knows that the small block Chevrolet V-8 first introduced in 1955 and still being manufactured today, is one of the most successful and reliable engines ever designed. As for performance, just ask any racer what is the winningest engine on any type of circuit. Whole books have been written concerning the legend of the small block V-8 so I'll not belabor this point further.

Secondly, Mr. MacLaren pokes a finger at the "ridiculous" Corvair. Again, I believe there is ample evidence of the excellence in engineering and design of the Corvair to counter his false claims of Nedrizes and those naive enough to believe what they say. As a past and present Corvair owner and driver with 20 years of professional automotive engineering experience, I can truthfully say that my Corvair is a better car than the Detroit iron you see today. I would be happy to race Mr. MacLaren, driving my Studebaker of his choice, in my 1956 turbocharged Corvair, on any sports car track.
