


The last word at the Holiday Party







One More Time With That Right Foot

Our last Vair Street Journal was dedicated to the use of our right foot (and it's use in operating our Corvairs!). The purpose was to inform you how to save gasoline while driving your car.

Because of your positive replies, we'll offer other ways your right foot can help you save gasoline expenses. We all know that it takes energy to move mass...or it takes gasoline to move your car. If and when you put your right foot (some drivers who have cars with automatic transmissions, use their left foot) on your brake pedal, you will loose all of that energy. The answer to this prob-

lem is to look ahead and anticipate your next stop.

If it's a red light, try to approach it slowly and it will be green when you reach it. You can let your right foot take a free ride! Relax, life is not meant to be a race between stop lights. If you are prone to drive full tilt all of the time, you will soon come to recognize that there will always be someone else who will drive faster than you can. Just ask Dale Earnhart Jr. or Jeff Gordon!

If you drive the same route regularly, you may discover that the stop lights are timed so that if you drive a certain speed, the stop lights will be green each time you arrive. (Your right foot gets another free ride! Except for feather touching the gas pedal).

The AAA studies show that acceleration and hard braking can lower gasoline mileage by as much as 33%! The message here is: Treat your right foot right and your right foot will treat you right! Luke, (Our ardent, loyal and resolute editor) said it would be alright and the right time to send this information right away...before you waste too much gasoline.




